## INFORMATION ON PROPOSED ORDINANCE

### Title

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 2-2-10 (ESTABLISHMENT OF ELECTION DISTRICTS AND VOTING PLACES) by amending Subsections (p), (t) and (x), all of Chapter 2 (ELECTIONS), Title 2 (GENERAL GOVERNMENT) of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1981, as amended; to amend and reordain Section 12-1-4 (ELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS; DATE AND MANNER OF ELECTION), all of Chapter 1 (SCHOOL DISTRICT AND SCHOOL BOARD), Title 12 (EDUCATION, SOCIAL SERVICES AND WELFARE) of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1981, as amended; and to amend and reordain "The Official Map of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, Designating Election Districts and Voting Places," adopted by Section 2-2-13 (MAP OF ELECTION DISTRICTS AND VOTING PLACES), all of Chapter 2 (ELECTIONS), Title 2 (GENERAL GOVERNMENT) of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1981, as amended.

### Summary

The proposed ordinance permanently moves the polling place of the South Port Election District to the Samuel Tucker School; renames the South Port Center Election District the Tucker - West Election District; updates the name of the Beth El Hebrew Congregation Election District; corrects a typographical error in the address of the Samuel Tucker School Election District; and updates Section 12-1-4 with the new names for the Tucker - West and Beth El Hebrew Congregation precinct.
