2000 Mount Vernon Avenue - Evening Star Cafe / Hi/Fi Tex-Mex BBQ Public Hearing and consideration of a Special Use Permit for additional outdoor seating, expanded outdoor dining hours, outdoor live entertainment, and a temporary trailer at an existing restaurant (amending SUP2012-00054); zoned: CL/Commercial Low.

Applicant: Majestic Grill, Inc., represented by M. Catharine Puskar, Attorney Planning Commission Action: Recommended Approval 6-1

City Council approved the Planning Commission recommendation with an amendment to Condition #23 stating, "The applicant shall control cooking odors, smoke, and any other air pollution from operations at the site and prevent them from becoming a nuisance to neighboring properties as determined by the Department of Transportation and Environmental Services. In order to mitigate impacts of smoke and odor from the smoker and prevent them from being a nuisance to neighboring properties, the applicant shall (1) relocate the smoker away from the western property line to be adjacent to the building stairwell; (2) extend the exhaust pipe up and above the main roof line of the building with the top of the exhaust pipe oriented toward Mt. Vernon Avenue; and (3) install a fan on the roof to dilute and further disperse the smoke. At the six month check-in, the performance of this equipment will be evaluated against the standard expressed in this condition. If necessary to meet this condition, adjustments to this equipment, or additional equipment, may be requirement.
