- On December 14, 2024, City Council established the Subcommittee to Review Standing Committees.
- The purpose of the subcommittee was to:
 - Research and evaluate the use of standing committees
 - Determine if/how standing committees could strengthen City governance
 - Better understand roles & responsibilities of committees
 - Make a recommendation to City Council



Goals and Objectives

Improve Decision Making

Enable in-depth analysis, expert input, and informed decision-making

Council Model Reform

Enhanced Community Engagement

Strengthen community participation, ensure diverse perspectives, and foster inclusive policymaking

Increased Transparency & Accountability

Promote openness in council operations, ensure accessible processes, and make decisions understandable to the public

Background

Standing Committee Definition

The **Standing Committee Model** is a governance structure where city councils have permanent standing committees established to address specific ongoing areas of responsibility or policy, ensuring consistent work and decisionmaking in those areas over time. The City currently has one standing committee, the **City Council Naming Committee.**

Background

Benefits to City Council

Allow more time for informed decision-making

 Standing committees will allow Councilmembers to engage with issues earlier and have a greater role in policy development

Develop areas of policy expertise

 The specialization of the standing committee will help members develop deeper subject-matter expertise in connected sectors of the City's work

Increase opportunities for direct community feedback

 Standing committees will also be a space for increased engagement with members of boards and commissions around topics that mean the most to them



Benefits to Alexandria Residents Modern and effective governance

• Standing committees provide a systematic way for Council and the community to collaboratively explore new and creative solutions

Increased responsiveness to local needs

 Since standing committees are more flexible than full Council meetings, they can be utilized to address emerging issues earlier in the policy development process

Better policy outcomes

 Standing committees can delve deeply into complex issues, conduct hearings, gather expert opinions, and consider stakeholder feedback

Ultimately standing committees will create a more knowledgeable, modernized, and effective city government that produces better results for all Alexandrians



Authority & Responsibilities

Conduct Legislative Review

Proposed legislation must be reviewed by the appropriate standing committee

Make Policy Recommendations

Committees provide guidance on draft legislation from staff and advise the rest of council on key legislative matters


Call Public Hearings


Members of the public can be called to comment on and provide their expertise on issues




