Over the past four years, I have had the pleasure of serving as a Member of the Environmental Policy Commission and have found the experience fulfilling and impactful. It is a real honor to participate in such a group that impacts the environmental progress of our city - pushing the city to do more, guiding policy, advising on budget asks, engaging on city lobbying efforts, asking developers to be more sustainable, and more. It's the embodiment of "act local, think global" and I love that Alexandria is so interested in addressing the climate crisis. As a sustainability professional with roots in the energy industry and green building community, I feel very at home with the Alexandria Environmental Policy Commission. The heart of my interests and experience lies at the nexus of sustainability and real estate, essentially the "green buildings" world, and I would love to continue contributing my knowledge and enthusiasm as a member of the EPC. (Have I talked to you about heat pumps?! Because right now I'm Really into them.) I work for the Urban Land Institute, a global, member-driven organization comprising more than 45,000 real estate and urban development professionals dedicated to advancing the Institute's mission of providing leadership in the responsible use of land and in creating and sustaining thriving communities worldwide. My specific position is Co-Executive Director of the ULI Randall Lewis Center for Sustainability in Real Estate, ), which leads the global real estate industry in creating buildings and places where people and the environment thrive. I am interested in continuing to serve on this Committee for a number of reasons, the first of which is that I deeply want to use my scientific, technical, and market expertise to better the entire city's building stock and overall sustainable land use. City policy has such a strong impact on the betterment of the built environment and our climate, and I want to contribute to improving sustainability across Alexandria. This includes topics such as energy efficiency, benchmarking, renewables, embodied carbon, health and wellness, resilience, waste and recycling, net-zero, and more. I also recognize that we have a climate emergency on this earth and a science-based impetus to take action as soon as possible to reduce the impacts of climate change. As a bio-engineer by education, and an energy nerd by profession, I get it. This is real. And Alexandria, having committed to the "We are Still In" pledge for the Paris Climate Accord goals, and having adopted a Climate Emergency, has a responsibility to play its part. Living in a Dillon Rule state certainly complicates things, but that just means we get extra creative when thinking through ways to get our community to be more sustainable. Granted, it's one thing to be aspirational about reducing the impacts of climate change and meeting a city's climate action goals – its another thing to operationalize those strategies and find a way for improvements to happen in the real world. Looking at policy incentives (carrots and sticks) that would motivate the building community to go green (beyond code, beyond the city's Green Building Policy) is often on my mind. Tying the motivations for and benefits of green buildings to the bottom line for buildings - increase in asset value, increased net operating income, reduced utility expenses and repairs/maintenance costs, increased rental rates, increased occupancy – is what I do in my day job in communicating with the real estate community and is a perspective I can continue to bring to the EPC as well. I've been quite vocal and engaged over my 4 years so far on the EPC, whether it be encouraging North Potomac Yard to be more innovative on sustainability design features, engaging deeply on the Energy & Climate Change Action Plan Task Force, encouraging the city to further analyze the science behind the stream restoration choices, proposing challenging legislative priorities that would enable Alexandria to make accelerate decarbonization, or firmly asking for additional FTEs to be funded to execute on the city's climate work. It's helpful to know that, at the end of the day, we're all on the same team – pushing for a better, healthier, more sustainable Alexandria. I am excited to continue contributing to our city's work on reducing carbon emissions and making a difference in our community.
