Per a recent City study, there are 16,806 users of Warwick during three months of usage. Primarily from neighborhood residents in the Warwick and Del Ray communities – two very active locations in the City - and City camps. Where do they go if the pool is closed?

Chinquapin will be closed for repairs this summer. If Warwick is closed also, that leaves only the Old Town pool as the one major pool in the entire City (the Houston pool is too small to affect the total numbers). Warwick attendance was 16,806 for the summer per the City's own study. Chinquapin's was 23,000 for the same time period (factoring in only the months that it will be closed for repairs). Old Town had 16,302 for the summer. Closing Warwick at the same time as Chinquapin means that

56,108 people – by the City's own numbers - would be forced into one location that already experiences long lines at times during the summer – a recipe for disaster.

In addition to the regular attendance, there are approximately 300 campers each week using Warwick. Closing Warwick means that those campers either add to the numbers at Old Town or do not get any aquatic experience. Many of these campers are lower income residents who have limited opportunities to learn to swim or play in the water.

The City also conducted a Needs assessment recently. Unmet pool demand is one of the highest complaints from citizens. Closing Warwick at the same time as closing Chinquapin is exactly the opposite of what the City should be doing. They can't meet the current demand, so they are going to force people into a vastly overcrowded situation that will just increase the public dissatisfaction with the pools. Not exactly a sound management strategy.

The City has invested in several improvements at Warwick over the past few years. Closing Warwick at this time means that those investments go to waste. While we understand that any more significant investments in the Warwick pool may not be practical in future years, using the pool for another year or two would mean that the existing improvements are utilized.

Solution:

Extending the use of the Warwick pool for another year allows the Warwick Village Citizens Association and the Advocates for Alexandria Aquatics to meet with the Virginia Theological Seminary (owners of the pool land) to see if private sector funds can be available to help the City out. It will allow for a planned transition to a City recommended spray ground there.

Extending the use of the Warwick pool also helps alleviate, to an extent, the crunch created by the closure of Chinquapin this summer.

The decision to keep Warwick open needs to be made soon so facility preparations can be done by opening day. Chinquapin closes as of May.

Public Hearing Statement

Mr. Mayor, Madam Vice Mayor, Mr. City Manager, and Members of City Council
My name is Tammy Mann, and I am Chair of the City's Children, Youth and Families Collaborative Commission (Commission). As you know, the City Council created the Commission in 2012 to coordinate citizen involvement on behalf of children, youth and their families, and to advise the City Council and the Alexandria City Schools Board on related policy and budgetary matters.

We appreciate the opportunity to speak this evening on the City Manager's proposed FY2014 General Fund Budget.

As a preliminary matter, we note that the proposed Budget documentation modifies the language associated with 3 of the 7 strategic goals adopted by Council in 2010 in the City Strategic Plan. The Commission is most concerned about the change in the language associated with Goal 4 of the Plan. The Strategic Plan was approved by City Council after significant deliberate work and careful consideration as to its wording. Additionally, the Commission is now drafting the City's first-ever, and aptly named, "Children and Youth Master Plan." The Commission recommends that the original language be carried forward in future documents to make clear to the public this City's commitment to this population. We recognize that certain budgetary cuts are inevitable however; we are concerned that the cuts proposed by the City Manager will have long-term negative impact on the City's children, youth, and their families, and especially felt by those in our community who are most vulnerable.

In recent years the City has seen programs that target children generate savings that have not been reinvested back into services that benefit children. For example, last year as a result of the state's decision to automate payments for child care subsidies for low-income working families, the City achieved nearly \$500 thousand in "savings". However, very little of these savings have been reinvested in programs that benefit Alexandria's children. This year, based on the presentation rendered in the March 4, budget work session, over \$2 million in budget reductions are charged to goal 4 of the City's Strategic Plan while only \$80 thousand are proposed to be reinvested in goal 4 programs and services.

Goal 4 programs benefit many low-income children, youth and families in the City. Therefore, it makes sense that greater attention would be devoted to reinvestments in this area of the budget. Often these families are least able to advocate for themselves, not because they do not care, but because many work multiple jobs just to meet basic needs. The Commission recommends that more reinvestment strategies be applied to this area of the budget when savings are realized. When cuts are necessary, the City should be able to identify and carefully consider the geographic, economic, and social areas of the City being asked to shoulder the burden.

There are two additional areas of concern the Commission would like to address. The first relates to the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget for our public schools, and the second addresses our concerns about affordable housing.

1. Alexandria City Public Schools Capital Improvement Plan Budget:

In 2009, the Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS) Board, division staff, and community stakeholders developed a five-year strategic plan for school district that included a strategy focused on providing clean and safe learning environments utilizing best practices for optimal teaching efficacy, energy efficiency, and environmental sustainability.

With regard to the ACPS CIP, we note that the City Manager's proposed budget allocates only \$10 million of the \$18 million requested by the School Superintendent – funding only 55% of the amount needed by the ACPS. If we continue to underfund CIP educational needs, the prolonged, cumulative effect of failing to meet such needs will have significant detrimental effect on student outcomes. Insufficient classrooms and instructional space have a direct impact on student learning and achievement. Lack of classroom space will result in larger class sizes and higher teacher/student ratios, a metric with a measurable and negative correlation with academic success.

Our failure to address this need now will likely result in lower student achievement and higher costs for the City in the future. For example, during the period from FY07 to FY13 we experienced an increase in student enrollment in the City of 2,782 students, an overall increase of 26.9% and an average increase of 3.2% per year. Projections are that student enrollment is likely to increase by 3.7% per year through FY19. From FY12 to FY13 the *actual* enrollment was nearly double the projected increase. Enrollment increases have been greatest at the elementary level, and soon we anticipate that space challenges will surface at the secondary levels.

Even as we support the need to invest in the proposed CIP the Commission believes with respect to space for preschool, more dialogue is needed to determine the best strategies to address needs in this area. This is consistent with previous communications the Commission has shared with City Council and members of the ACPS School Board.

2. Affordable Housing:

A decline in affordable housing options is a key area with significant long-term impact on Alexandria's children, youth, and their families. Despite favorable economic benefits associated with residential development efforts, low- to middle-income residents have been


adversely affected. The Commission calls the City Council's attention to the social, economic, and emotional hardships children and families endure when they are displaced from their homes and often forced out of the City.

While the proposed overall expenditures to the Office of Housing will increase by 6%, there remains a significant gap between affordable housing options available to low and moderate families and the need in our community. For example, under the Proposed Budget, the number of affordable units pledged by developers dropped from 61 units in FY12 to 10 units in FY14. We also note a drop in the number of low and moderate income Alexandrians with access to loan assistance through the home ownership program. A decrease in lending support to subsidize the costs associated with producing and/or preserving affordable rental or special needs housing is another concern.

The Commission recognizes that the City Council has long sought to provide affordable housing options, and has incorporated the need for affordable housing in its Master Plan, Small Area Plans, Strategic Plan of 2010, and more recently, in its Draft Master Housing Plan. The Commission recommends that the City continue to work collaboratively with community stakeholders to address affordable housing options for residents of all ages and incomes, and with emphasis on ensuring all families and children have a place in our community. The Commission believes progress in this area is essential if we are to achieve facets of the City's vision statement, which explicitly calls for attention to diversity and inclusion as core components of a thriving, vibrant community.

The Commission appreciates the City's ongoing commitment to Children, Youth, and Families. Thank you for your time this evening.

Closing Warwick Pool this summer is a bad idea!

At this point, we might as well put up a sign that says, "Welcome to Alexandria, please go to Fairfax or Arlington County for your pool needs."

- This is the wrong decision at the wrong time.

In 2008 there 10,557 students enrolled in ACPS and 7 outdoor pools to serve families in the summer.

The proposal for this summer is to have 2 outdoors pools open (while simultaneously closing Chinquapin).

September 2013 projections are for 13,707 students enrolled in ACPS, accounting for 88 percent of the city's children.

That means 30% more children and 70% fewer pools.

It's shameful.

Last summer, there were long lines at Old Town pool. Imagine the mess you will have created with Chinquapin closed AND the closure of Warwick! Why would you make the situation worse?

It's also a waste of tax payer money that was already used to make improvements to Warwick. Lack of planning by the City and a poor management decisions by the City have created this problem – not the citizens.

- 16,806 people use Warwick each summer. Neighborhood residents and City campers comprise most of that number.

56,000 swimmers will be required to share space that normally supports 16,000 swimmers.

Unmet pool needs is one of the largest citizen complaints in the City. Prepare yourselves for more complaints!!!!

Dear Alexandria City Council and Mayor,

As a resident of Del Ray near the Warwick neighborhood, I am writing to express in the strongest terms my opposition to the proposed closing of the Warwick Outdoor Swimming Pool. Here are a few of the reasons why I think it's important to keep this pool open.

1) It is one of the only walkable children's activities available in the summer. Closing this pool would mean more driving and parking. I understand that the funds saved by closing the pool would go to the transportation budget, and if you're creating more driving for everyone, it all just rather defeats the purpose. There is no doubt my children and those of my neighbors would be swimming less and driving more if this pool is closed.

2) Having a walkable city is why we and so many others choose to pay the high housing costs and corresponding property taxes to live here. In a metropolitan area of so many commuters, Alexandria's cache is in its walk and bike-ability. If Warwick closes, the only available pool will be too far for my kids to even ride their bikes.

3) The Warwick pool serves many black and Hispanic children who learn the life skill of swimming here. Several studies have shown that children of these demographics in many places have more limited access to pools and instruction, and they tend to drown more frequently as a result. Do we really want that to play out here, too? Some kids in Del Ray have a parent who stays at home and drives their kids to private pools. Those are the "haves," and to take away swimming from the "have-not's" is not the direction we want to go in.

4) I'd gladly pay double the entrance fee to help offset costs, and that would be cheaper for everyone than having us drive and park at another pool. The doubled price of \$4 each would still be more accessible to the have-nots than taking the bus to the remaining open pool.
