**A statement by Bert Ely on behalf of the Old Town
Civic Association regarding proposed bike lanes on King Street**

March 15, 2014

Mr. Mayor and members of Council, I am Bert Ely, and I am here today to speak on behalf of the Old Town Civic Association to urge Council to consider an alternative to the King Street bike-lanes proposal before you today.

OTCA has many bike riders in its membership and strongly supports safe biking practices along Alexandria's heavily traveled streets. To this end, OTCA supports the balanced, reasonable use of the City's streets and sidewalks in a manner that does not favor one mode of transportation over another while ensuring the safe passage of all travelers, regardless of their mode of transportation.

While OTCA recognizes the importance of bicycles as a mode of transportation, OTCA opposes initiatives that unduly favor bicycles over motor vehicles and pedestrians. In particular, OTCA opposes the narrowing of vehicle travel lanes and the removal of parking spaces in order to accommodate designated bicycle lanes. In our opinion, shared-lane marking, or "sharrows," provide the best manner to provide for bicycle traffic on streets where the necessary width of vehicle travel lanes and parking requirements do not permit the striping of dedicated bicycle lanes.

While that portion of King Street where dedicated bicycle lanes have been proposed lies outside of Old Town, Old Towners routinely drive and bike on that portion of King Street and therefore are concerned about the safety implications of the dedicated bike-lane proposal before Council today. More broadly, OTCA is concerned that bicycle policies imposed elsewhere in the city, such as the proposal before you today, may be inappropriately imposed on Old Town streets.

More specifically, that portion of King Street between Janney's Lane and West Cedar Street is simply too narrow to accommodate the volume of car and truck traffic that travel on King and to have two dedicated bicycle lanes. The safety risks of having dedicated bicycle lanes would be further magnified by placing them on a hill as that will lead to high-speed biking downhill, at the bottom of which there are numerous pedestrians crossing King at the Metro, while the uphill grade will see some bikers weaving quite a bit as they huff and puff to pedal their way up that steep hill. We also are sympathetic to the parking concerns of the homeowners who live along that portion of King Street as Old Town has similar on-street parking needs. A staff suggestion that homeowners could use a valet parking service in lieu of having their guests park on the street smacks of a "let them eat cake" attitude.

To better accommodate the relatively low volume of bicycle traffic on King Street between Janney's Lane and West Cedar Street, OTCA recommends that Council reject the staff proposal for dedicated bicycle lanes on that section of King and instead determine if painting sharrows on King Street can even be justified. Perhaps the best course of action is to do nothing. At the same time, Council should not reduce the number of parking places along that section of King.
