CURRICULUM VITE

Al Cox, FAIA made significant contributions to the public design review process and the built environment while practicing in local government for almost **three decades** as **City Architect** for Alexandria, Virginia. Mr. Cox conceived and implemented several processes to streamline development review and **build consensus** among the City, architects, developers and citizens. By building relationships with all stakeholders and encouraging constructive **public participation** in the regulatory process, he became respected as a **fair-minded, effective mediator**, guiding development teams to the most appropriate design solution and **consistently pushing them to accomplish their best work**. As Historic Preservation Manager for the City's Board of Architectural Review, Mr. Cox's conviction that the City is a living, evolving organism, and not a museum frozen in time, fostered successful new infill and the adaptive reuse of thousands of historic buildings. **A passionate preservationist**, he was also a **proactive advocate for good design**, regardless of style. His philosophy, education and private sector experience was grounded in historic preservation for its cultural, economic and environmental benefits without limiting creative, appropriate modern design alternatives. The role of City Architect and the design review processes created by Mr. Cox provides a **model that can, and should, be repeated** in local governments throughout the country.

NARRATIVE



William Allan Cox, FAIA, created the position of **Alexandria City Architect** – the first since the City's establishment in 1749 – after recognizing the need for a qualified liaison between local government departments, developers, their design teams and citizens. This position serves as an empowered advocate for architects during the regulatory development review process and is a model for fostering a culture of historic preservation and good design in local government. Mr. Cox brought a unique perspective to work in government because of his prior experience as principal in an award-winning **private architectural practice**; participation in non-profit **preservation advocacy** organizations; and leadership of a diverse, inner-city **civic association**. He is recognized by both citizens and developers as a trusted mediator in what are often confrontational disputes regarding preservation and land use.

Mr. Cox began work for the City of Alexandria, Virginia Planning Department in 1991 on a two-year contract as staff to the two Boards of Architectural Review (BAR) during creation of their first Design Guidelines. His many initiatives included investigating early materials and local construction technologies to help establish building construction dates. The City continues to use this resource to assist citizens and the BARs during applications for alterations and demolition. He has presented his ongoing research in numerous public lectures and walking tours for local, national and international groups. Additionally, Mr. Cox assisted the BAR with training, architectural conservation analyses, and reports on the appropriate use of modern materials. When suburban development pressures threatened historic properties and their contexts, he obtained a state grant and performed the first survey of historic buildings in Alexandria outside of Old Town in order to include evaluation of these properties in neighborhood and transportation master plans. Mr. Cox supported identification, analysis and adaptive reuse of historic architecture **as a living component of urban design** while encouraging the creation of compatible new buildings in vibrant, human-scale urban settings.

In 1993, Mr. Cox was named **City Architect** – a position he helped create and structure to provide architect selection, general project design and architectural conservation advice to City staff and the BAR. This position also coordinates between the Departments of Transportation, Parks & Recreation, Code Administration, General Services, and Historic Alexandria. In this role, Mr. Cox led multi-disciplinary teams using historic preservation and urban design as tools to stabilize and enhance the settings of buildings in fragile urban neighborhoods. He is also a strong advocate of **public participation** in the regulatory design review process as a means to critically evaluate the local aesthetic and cultural significance of both historic and contemporary architecture.

The City Architect helps design professionals navigate the increasingly complex public entitlement process, which Mr. Cox helped streamline by creating the Concept Review policy for the BAR, enabling developers to gauge public acceptance of large projects before investing tens of thousands of dollars in engineering and legal fees prior to Planning Commission and City Council review. By clearly articulating community goals through published design guidelines and by recommending design alternatives, where appropriate, **without dictating the outcome**, Mr. Cox has encouraged architects to achieve their best work. Architects, developers and citizens alike consistently comment that this approach creates better projects.

In 2002 Mr. Cox was asked by the Code Enforcement Department to help establish and manage a City Field Office to expedite projects in the new-urbanist style Carlyle/East Eisenhower area, overseeing 13 million square feet of new mixed-use development in an old railway yard immediately adjacent to Old Town. This multi-department, developer-funded field office provided on-site plan review, permits and construction inspection and is a model for improving the relationship between developers and regulatory agencies by making the City a **non-adversarial and integral part of the development team** on large projects. Results included improved project safety and code compliance for the public as well as significant savings in time and money for the developer. While with Code, Mr. Cox also coordinated numerous building code training workshops for Northern Virginia architects, reducing the time and expense of future permit revisions.

In 2010, Mr. Cox returned to the Department of Planning & Zoning as Historic Preservation Manager to lead the five-member Board of Architectural Review staff. He served in this position until his retirement in March 2020. Major accomplishments during this period included streamlining the Parker-Gray BAR Design Guidelines and greatly expanding administrative review of routine maintenance items; consolidation of the two BARs into a single board to reduce the number of public meetings; production of City-wide public symposiums on architecture; participation in development of the City's Waterfront Master Plan; and the production of new software for a digital field survey of 5,000 buildings in the Old & Historic Alexandria District by volunteers using handheld mobile devices. The BAR's training and policies for preservation of identified historic material is the strongest in its 74-year history while review of appropriate modern construction is streamlined, more predictable and less expensive for the public.

The City Architect position has now been repeated in multiple departments in Alexandria where an architect's design, problem solving, project management and community outreach skills have significantly improved processes within and outside local government.

I began my architectural practice in Dallas, TX in the 1970s focusing on historic preservation and adaptive reuse. Our firm restored many historic buildings, including the Texas Governor's Mansion and the Texas School Book Depository Sixth Floor Museum. I served as President of my civic association when we initiated a city master plan and created a historic district in Dallas' oldest neighborhood, where Kathy and I lived and worked. As Executive Director of the Dallas Historic Preservation League, I served on the City's Landmark Commission. During that period, I learned that restoring buildings surrounded by parking lots was not sustainable and that it required the synergetic efforts of residents, businesses and government working together to build a more beautiful and sustainable city.

My wife and I moved to Alexandria in 1989 because we fell in love with its extraordinary history and human-scale architectural character. I was fortunate to be hired by the City in 1991 to help staff the Boards of Architectural Review and spent the next 29 years as City Architect working with all of the City departments to improve the urban design and infrastructure of neighborhoods throughout the City, from Old Town to Cameron Station and Carlyle to Del Ray/Potomac Yard. In that role, I was asked to assist RP&CA staff and the Waterfront Committee with the first master plan for Windmill Hill Park. I later had the opportunity to work extensively with P&Z staff, the Olin Studio and the public on design development of the 2012 Waterfront Master Plan, including relocation of the Old Dominion Boat Club and the preservation of historic warehouses and the approval of all new development by the BAR. The result of almost 100 public meetings over multiple years was a joint vision for a world class Alexandria waterfront that would become a public focal point for residents and tourists.

Having met each of you, I am sure you are aware of my passion for the public planning process, good architectural/urban design, environmental sustainability and historic preservation. I would like to use the institutional knowledge I acquired working for the City to continue to enhance our waterfront for the benefit of residents, visitors and the surrounding businesses to ensure that it continues to contribute to our economic vitality and quality of life. Therefore, I humbly request your support to serve as the representative of the Old Town Civic Association on the Alexandria Waterfront Commission.
