WHEREAS, the cultural diversity of our communities is made up of many languages, beliefs, and traditions which strengthen the social fabric of our diverse society through their heritage, traditions and culture; and

WHEREAS, generations of Asian- and Pacific Islander Americans have contributed to our country and City through their hard work, love of family and friends, and their service in our Armed Forces. We are grateful for their service in our military, and for protecting our Constitution and freedoms; and

WHEREAS, this month we remember the first Japanese citizens who came to the United States on May 7, 1843, and honor the numerous Chinese workers who helped lay the tracks of the transcontinental railroad, which was completed on May 10, 1869; and

WHEREAS, during the Month of May, Alexandria Library is hosting a series of events and workshops, book club discussions, and lectures highlighting Asian-American and Pacific Islander culture and its presence and influence in the city (www.alexlibraryva.org); and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JUSTIN M. WILSON, Mayor of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and on behalf of the Alexandria City Council, do hereby recognize May 2022, as:

“ASIAN-AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER HERITAGE MONTH”
