RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT PROPOSED INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT APPLICATION FOR THE FEDERAL INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING (LOW-NO AND BUSES AND BUS FACILITIES) FOR FY 2022

WHEREAS, in 2021, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act) was signed into law, and in 2022, funded \$1.1 billion and \$372 for the U.S. Department of Transportation's Low or No Emissions (Low-No) and Buses and Bus Facilities discretionary grant programs, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of Low-No is to fund the transition of transit fleet to the lowest polluting and most energy efficient transit vehicles and Buses and Bus Facilities Programs assists in the financing of buses and bus facilities capital projects, including replacing, rehabilitating, purchasing or leasing buses or related equipment, and rehabilitating, purchasing, constructing or leasing bus-related facilities; and

WHEREAS, projects are scored based on a merit criteria review by the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Transit Administration. Evaluation criteria include: demonstration of need, demonstration of benefits, planning and local/regional prioritization, local financial commitment, project implementation strategy, and technical, legal and financial capacity. Additional priority considerations include climate change, environmental justice, racial equity and barriers to opportunity, creating good –paying jobs, zero emission fleet transition plan with a focus on work force development, and other selection criteria; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Alexandria commits to support the transition of the DASH fleet to 100% zero emissions buses by the year 2037 in support of the City's Eco-City initiative and Environmental Action Plan 2040; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Alexandria desires to submit applications for an allocation of funds up to \$50 million through the DOT 2022 Low-No and Buses and Bus Facilities Program for the City of Alexandria, Virginia; and

WHEREAS, up to \$50 million is required to fund critical transportation and sustainability needs in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia:

- 1. the City Council of the City of Alexandria hereby supports this application for an allocation of up to \$50 million through the U.S. Department of Transportation Low-No and Buses and Bus Facilities Program; and
- 2. the City Council of the City of Alexandria hereby grants authority for the City Manager to execute all necessary documents that may be required under this program.

Dear Mayor Wilson and Members of City Council:

At its May 18 meeting, the Transportation Commission voted to endorse the staff-recommended projects for the FY 2022 Low or No Emission (Low-No) and Buses and Bus Facilities program through the Federal Transit Administration.

The following projects (\$44.7 million estimated total) will be submitted within these applications, and the Commission endorses a submission of up to \$50 million in the event cost estimates increase:

- FY23 Bus Replacement (\$17 million): Retire and replace ten (10) buses and five (5) trolleys with electric
- FY24 Bus Replacement (\$10.8 million): Retire and replace ten (10) buses with electric
- FY24 Expansion Buses (\$2.5 million): Upgrade six (6) Smart Scale clean diesel buses to electric
- Charging Equipment (\$2.4 million): Install required charging infrastructure to support new electric buses
- Electric upgrades at DASH Facility (\$10 million): Build new electrical service, including onsite equipment and infrastructure to support all electric bus charging requirements fleet conversion up to 6 megawatts of power
- Workforce Development (\$2 million): Required 5% of federal request

This request supports the goals of the Alexandria Mobility Plan and the Environmental Action Plan 2040. The Transportation Commission appreciates the opportunity to review staff recommendations for Lo-No Grant and Bus and Bus Facilities grant applications, as well as to provide its endorsement to Council.





Grant Requests



- In 2018, the City committed to shifting to an all-electric bus fleet by the year 2037.
- In FY 23 and FY 24, 25 buses (including 5 trollies) are meeting useful life and need to be replaced (DASH Fleet Replacement plan).
- To replace hybrid with electric buses (+ associated charging infrastructure) will cost approximately
- DASH is ultimately planning for a fleet of up to 140 buses and needs to upgrade the electrical capacity of the existing DASH building to handle the ultimate charging needs for the DASH campus – including the new facility.
- approximately \$45 million scalable up to \$50 million (to account for updated estimates during FTA To be strategic and seek max available funding, staff broke requests into projects totaling review).




