Emergency Financial Assistance	Eviction Prevention	Food Security
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 255 households supported through funding provided by City Council early in the pandemic• 13,128 individuals (to date) supported by the Community Access and Emergency Assistance grant program managed by ACT for Alexandria	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Rent, Security Deposit and Utility payments- 2,862 households (<i>duplicated count</i>)• 70 City and ACPS staff assisted with the processing of 4,300 requests for City emergency and rental assistance with \$5M distributed to 1,600 households	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• ALIVE! and local food pantries –supported approximately 11,500 residents per month (\$3.1M)• Grocery Gift Card Program - 7,024 residents supported• Food and misc. household goods to an est. 3,500 individuals isolated/quarantined (\$1.8M)

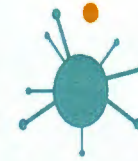


Nonprofit & Faith Based Service Delivery

91 Nonprofits provided emergency financial assistance, food & supplies, technology access, health care and other aid through *ACT Now COVID Response Fund* grant awards (\$904,000)

6 Nonprofits & Faith Based Partners- provided emergency financial assistance and community access support with *initial City funding* (\$300,000)

57 Community Partners provided ongoing safety net services with grant funding through *the Alexandria Resilience Fund* (\$1.89M)



Supporting Our Community continued



Service Navigation-Community Access

Eviction Prevention Task Force and 2 Community Partners supported provided initial service navigation support- **1,097 households to eviction prevention and safety net services**

8 additional Community Partners continued providing service navigation support through the Community Access and Emergency Assistance grant program - **1,644 households supported to date (\$1.2M)**
