

Nonprofit & Faith Based Service Delivery

91 Nonprofits provided emergency financial assistance, food & supplies, technology access, health care and other aid through *ACT Now COVID Response Fund* grant awards (\$904,000) **6 Nonprofits & Faith Based** Partners- provided emergency financial assistance and community access support with *initial City funding* (\$300,000) **57 Community Partners** provided ongoing safety net services with grant funding through the Alexandria Resilience Fund (\$1.89M)

Service Navigation-Community Access

Eviction Prevention Task Force and 2 Community Partners supported provided initial service navigation support- 1,097 households to eviction prevention and safety net services 8 additional Community Partners continued providing service navigation support through the Community Access and Emergency Assistance grant program - **1,644 households supported to date** (\$1.2M)
