Before you vote, please listen to and review ALL of the comments from residents that have been sent during the duration of this project, not just a vocal, dogmatic few. And, consider the input of the city's civic associations. I am active in my Wakefield-Tarleton Civic Association, and the majority of my neighbors are concerned about the implementation of center-running lanes for the entire length of Duke St. Ask yourself how this project began and what problem is was expected to address. And, ask, at what cost will the proposed solution of center running lanes address a portion of or all of the problem set. The proposal before you relies, at best, on a questionable assumptions, to include: • Ridership projections based on free Dash fares, which are not funded; • Riders' willingness to walk farther (in all sorts of weather) to access the bus because the number of stops will be reduced • The unproveable notion that a small, limited survey of potential riders claiming they would "consider" riding with improved service, actually materializes. Recall, the project began as an effort to increase accessibility; reducing stops does not help the elderly, disabled or those with small children. The single largest problem for any proposal to improve throughput on Duke is that the work to improve access to	Post Tags	

Telegraph Road hasn't taken place. No one can plausibly claim to have a fix for Duke St. without tackling the primary problem, which is the multiple, daily back ups generated by eastbound traffic from Quaker to access Telegraph (much of it passing through to Maryland). Compared to operations today, the average trip for the entire length of Duke (which rarely would anyone ride) is estimated, at most, to save about 5 minutes in peak hours, based on the advisory group's plan relying on the rosiest of factors. This is hardly worth the sacrifice of:

• Narrowing lane width to 10 ft (forcing emergency vehicles and trucks to squeeze down the entire stretch, potentially delaying emergency support for residents and businesses along this road, which will eventually house our hospital),

 Forcing all left turns from my neighborhood (and those on the north and south edges of Duke) onto fewer access roads for left turns. This poses an unnecessary risk for pedestrians along those access roads (such as S. Gordon), especially for children at play, · Forcing motorists to execute U-turns to reach businesses that were once accessed via traditional means. I am not confident delivery vehicles and semitrucks will be able to reliably execute these turns. And, will this reduce commerce at some businesses because residents simply won't bother? Are the current landowners that would need to cede land to support the concept even willing to do so, and at what cost? There are simply too many assumptions to justify the soaring cost of this project, especially if you support center bus lanes for Duke St.

The began as an effort to spend the grant money for improved access to bussing along Duke St.; this is a noble goal. Having relied on the bus for work, I support the addition of weather shelters at stops and improved pedestrian crossings and sidewalks along Duke St. I also support signal priority for DASH buses and school buses for the length of Duke St. These are measures the city could implement and then assess next steps. Center-running bus lanes, however, are a bridge to far. Please, do not pursue a costly solution for a problem that doesn't exist! Focus your efforts on fixing the Telegraph access problem!

I was able to speak at the PC and was struck with the apparent unawareness by the PC of how the Duke Street In Motion (DSIM) and the West Taylor Run Parkway and Duke Street Intersection (WTRP) projects relate to each other. I was not at the TC, but a friend and neighbor who was there told me the outcome was the same. While the DSIM is a planning study and in theory has time for reevaluation, the WTRP is a final design project slated for construction in the coming years. The design decisions made on WTRP will influence the outcome of DSIM and vice versa. Last week, you should have received a letter from the Taylor Run Citizens Association (TRCA) outlining our concerns. Please let me know if you did not get it. I was also struck at how the slide presentation at the PC, and apparently also at the TC. The TRCA sent a similar letter to the PC and the TC as the one we sent you. The PC started with the acknowledgement of receiving the letter and the expressed concerns about the lack of engagement with the communities. The City staff's response simply was that both project teams would engage with the communities impacted in the future and that there is time to adjust the design. I find that hard to believe. Unless the WTRP project is delayed by a year or two, there is no time for adjustments to the DSIM recommendations, as promised by the City Staff. I was very disappointed that the outcome of both meetings was a 6 to 0 vote to proceed with the advisory board's recommended design. The PC did state that there is a missed opportunity to increase the total budget of the project by combining federal funding with the \$87 million dollars awarded from local sources. You should have received a letter from the PC with a statement that additional funding for the DSIM should be explored. 	what the objectives are, and other details that can influence both projects. At times, the PC appeared uninterested in listening to details, such as lane widths and slip lanes, and right turn restrictions. The WTRP project's schedule and final deliverable requires solid decisions to be made sooner rather than later. The WTRP's design is flawed and is not ready to move further. The much-debated conversion of a two-way service lane to a one-way service lane from Cambridge/Roth to Telegraph could be avoided with proper planning and design solutions. We look forward to these much- anticipated stakeholder meetings which the city has told both the TC and PC will take place soon. We therefore request you delay the vote, reject the Advisory Board's recommendations, or approve with the unconditional direction to start engagement with the impacted communities and delay the WTRP schedule until the DSIM design issues have been resolved. Description	As a user of bus service at least twice a week during rush hour (Metro bus 21c/8W or DASH Line 102), I do not support Duke Street in Motion as proposed because it will be ineffective and does not address the most important transit issue faced by riders like me, the frequency of bus service (both current and proposed). In my view, the costs associated with the proposal (anywhere from \$87 million to \$130 million) far outweigh the benefit of a few minutes quicker travel time per bus ride. The downsides are well documented, and former DASH CEO Sandy Modell explained it quite well in her piece in the Alexandria Times. The key issue for riders is frequency of bus service. In my instance, I take the bus to a Metro station. It works well unless I miss a bus time. I have to catch the correct bus. If I am less than one minute late, I have to wait 20-30 minutes for the next bus. It would be far preferable to have more frequent bus service as it is currently structured than shaving a few minutes off the ride itself (savings which evaporate with fewer bus stops). To be candid, whether it takes an extra 3-4 minutes per ride or not does not matter to me or most other bus riders. During those 3 minutes for each ride on the bus, riders use that time to catch up on the news, the sale of the Commanders, or work. The lost 20-30 minutes due to infrequency of bus departures does matter. As you know, I have published articles on the shortcomings of Duke Street in		
	Motion, including its staggering expense for little benefit, weak public support, reduction of hus stops (which defeats		
	reduction of bus stops (which defeats any time savings per ride), COG finding strong existing transportation equity,		
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among other reasons. There is no compelling rationale for it as proposed.

As well, while the city has an \$87 million grant, a recent city financial report placed it at \$116 million. At a Duke Street in Motion Advisory Group meeting, a member (Mindy Lyle) verified that escalation costs were not included, which she estimated at 30% for the \$100 million Option A - placing final costs at \$130 million. In public forums, the city insists that it will stay within the \$87 million funding level, but never says what will be dropped from the plan if costs exceed \$87 million. What will be prioritized if budget becomes an issue? At Potomac Yards, the southern entrance was eliminated, setting off a firestorm when the public learned of it. Please, let's not repeat that mistake.

Rapid bus transit is a useful element of commuting, but it often bypasses and provides far less benefit those living along the corridor, than would a more functional local bus service. BRT systems are set up to focus on commuting traffic, but in focusing on the overall speed between end points, it reduces the number of stops, which are essential for producing a functional transit system capable of reducing overall car reliance within the region, which is the stated vision of the plan. As someone who rides the bus, the main reasons I do not use bus service more frequently include:		
	- Stops being farther apart than desirable, which will be further reduced (this should be a concern in the stated goal of increasing equity and accessibility for disadvantaged segments of the population, too)		
•	- Buses not running frequently enough to be convenient, which is noted as being addressed by the ability to use more of the bus lines, but as several of these

the core commute, it does not fully address the issue (the plan focuses much more heavily on travel time than wait time, which is equally important)

As a member Longview Neighborhood, I am part of a number of concerned residents that are particularly apprehensive about the proposed revisions to the Duke Street Service Road segment between Telegraph Road and Cambridge. This segment is the only way into our neighborhood, and we already face extreme delays in being able to enter and exit the neighborhood due to congestion at both West Taylor and Cambridge - with the Cambridge intersection being impassible at times of Bishop Ireton pick up and drop off, but at other times as well (and this is without MacArthur Elementary in session). We have been told as a community that this service road modification is not set in stone, the revision appears to be te only wat=y to provide a bike path segment in that stretch, which is a clearly stated priority of the plan.

The current plan is a piecemeal approach based on constraints of the many diverse conditions along Duke, which will likely become more disparate in the face of budget constraints and cost escalation. Ironically, the use of different BRT approaches in each of the four segments will create new transitions between each segment's different strategy, which are similar to the transitional areas that cause congestion and safety hazards now. The plan seems at best a compromise, and while it might be reasonable for communities along the corridor to make sacrifices were the plan to provide a robust comprehensive transit solution, it is not reasonable for residents to accept impacts for a plan that compromises its own stated goals. Proceeding with a piecemeal plan will undermine its success and jeopardize implementation of a more comprehensive vision for the corridor in the future, by reinforcing the perception that integrated transit if not effective.

As a design professional, I know that a plan can change substantially from Schematic Design through Construction, and that elements of the design will be fine tuned and revisited throughout the process. I also know, however, that the Schematic Design represents the likely direction of the project and should not be adopted without specifically stipulating aspects of the design that need to be reevaluated. I would request that if the Commission is intent of advancing the proposed plan that they include stipulations to maintain access to the communities along the corridor.

I also know, however, that the Schematic Design represents the likely direction of the project and should not be adopted without specifically stipulating aspects of the design that need to be reevaluated. I would request that if the Commission is intent of advancing the proposed plan that they include stipulations to maintain access to the communities along the corridor.

These proposals should be considered in tandem, not sequentially.		
	While there are many issues to be worked through, in the interest of brevity, I will focus on my most significant of these concerns: maintaining two-way		•
	vehicle travel on the Duke Access Road between West Taylor Run and Hilton. Elimination of two-way travel on this		
	stretch will significantly reduce access for residents in hundreds of homes east of Taylor Run. All traffic entering the neighborhood from Duke Street would		
	have to travel the length of WTR to Janney's Lane, turn right on Janney's, and then right again on ETR (or another road) to backtrack into and wind through the neighborhood. By way of example,		
	this will add almost an extra mile (0.8) every time I return home from the nearby light at WTR and Duke; it will be similar for others in the community. This		A
	increased travel time will affect residents, delivery services, emergency vehicles, and other drivers each and		
	every time they enter the neighborhood; increase vehicle emissions; increase congestion after recent increase

local streets; and increase risks to the safety of elementary children walking to and from the rebuilt MacArthur on Janney's after it opens. Improving access for cut-through traffic is laudable, but must be carefully weighed against significantly reducing access for local residents.

In summary, please postpone any decision now on DSIM options that will limit what can be done later to address significant concerns that have already been well and repeatedly articulated by the community. Thank you in advance for your consideration.
