Hello everyone,

I have a few questions on the attached from our Tuesday docket:

1) As it pertains to the change in 5-8-74(1)(b), is it correct that even though the sunset language kicked in on 6/30/2006, we have provided the permits since June 2005 without interruption?

2) Does anyone have any data available about how many of these home health-care permits are issued each year?

3) When Council approved the changes to this section in 2008, we also asked for some other recommendations on child-care workers in home. I don't know whatever became of that (I believe Laura was looking into this):

WHEREUPON, upon motion by Councilman Krupicka, seconded by Councilman Gaines and carried 6-1, City Council: (1) received the recommendations of the Traffic and Parking Board for changes in the City's permit parking program; and (2) requested the City Attorney to docket an ordinance implementing the recommended changes. Council issued a directive to staff to review the plan for the inclusion of some creative alternatives for allowing parking for daycare workers during the day. The voting was as follows: Krupicka "aye" Pepper "aye" Gaines "aye" Lovain "aye" Euille "aye" Smedberg "no" Wilson "aye"

4) Why aren't we also repealing (or substantially modifying) Sec. 5-8-95 "Contracts for purchase and repair of meters," while we're in here?

5) Why aren't we also updating a through d of 5-8-96 to account for the Multi-Space meters? It seems as though as written, the multi-space meters don't comply with a - d.

6) Why aren't we just starting over again with 5-8-93 (c)? It seems as though our changes are making a section that already reads like a "choose your own adventure book" into something even more confusing.
