Mayor, Vice Mayor, Members of Council, My name is Jim Durham, I live at 622 Fort Williams Parkway in Seminary Ridge. I am also speaking as Chair of the Alexandria Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC).

My remarks today provide a short update on recent changes in BPAC associated with our increased emphasis on pedestrian issues.

First, We have started building a team that is focused on pedestrian issues as their primary responsibility.

- This week, the Committee elected its first Vice Chair for Pedestrians, Jerry King, to fill this new position.
- We have recruited David Kaplan, a member of the City's Commission on Aging with interests in pedestrian safety, to serve on our Committee.
- And we are actively recruiting others, such as a member from the Commission on Persons with Disabilities to join our team.

I expect to be able to report to you later this year that we have a full team in place, but I wanted you to know we have started to build that team and welcome any who wish to join us in helping to make Alexandria more walkable.

Second. In a manner similar to our monthly bicycle rides, we have started organizing walks in the City, that are both interesting and fun. ~~For example,~~ Stroll through Haunted Alexandria and a Walk to the Annual Boat Parade of Lights are two recent events. We post information about upcoming walks and rides in an on-line Meet- Up Group: Alexandria Biking and Walking.

Third. We will be hosting a Complete Streets and Pedestrian Safety discussion on Monday April 21st from 6:15 to 7:30PM at the Lee Center. I would like to invite you and members of the public to this event to learn more about the Complete Streets Concept, Pedestrian Safety and the City's Complete Streets Program. We thank the City Council for establishing the policies, and want to help better inform our residents about what it is, what it means and how implementation will improve our quality of life, particularly in making Alexandria more walkable.

In summary, we welcome you to encourage others to join our growing pedestrian-focused team, our walks in Alexandria, and we hope to see you at our April 21st Complete Streets and Pedestrian Safety event. Thank you..
