Subject: Housing and Human Service Budget Recommendations for FY2015

ALIVE! (ALexandrians InVolved Ecumenically) would like to add our support to the letter sent March 21 by the Alexandria Budget Advocacy Coalition for Housing and Human Services, concerning priorities in the FY2015 City budget. ALIVE! is a non-profit social services organization, representing 42 affiliated congregations of different faiths, as well as members of the community at large.

As you may know, ALIVE! is the largest private safety net for those in need in the City of Alexandria, providing \$260,000 each year in emergency assistance for rent, utilities and medical needs; feeding on average more than 2000 individuals each month; offering quality early childhood education to 38 children of working low-income Alexandrians; delivering transitional housing and support services to four mothers and their children to help them achieve self-sufficiency; and delivering furniture and housewares each week to support families in need.

At ALIVE!, we see families and individuals each day that need assistance, whether it is help to avoid homelessness, food to feed their families, a decent place to live, or affordable childcare, often because rent is taking a significant portion of the family's income. This need has not decreased as the economy has improved, but rather the demand for ALIVE!'s services has remained steady, and, even as we have increased our assistance, we are not able to meet all of the need. Low-income families in Alexandria need the support of the City as well as the non-profit community, and we encourage the Council, as you consider the FY2015 budget, to include the priorities outlined in the March 21 letter.

Alexandria has always been a caring community with an interest in maintaining a diverse population. We urge you to continue to provide the resources critical to working families and at-risk individuals in our community.

Re: Housing and Human Service Budget Recommendations for FY2015

As you consider the FY 2015 proposed city budget, we urge you to make additional and needed investments in housing, health and human services programs. These recommendations were developed through a collaborative process of nonprofit housing developers, human service providers, and advocacy organizations identifying community needs and then making recommendations for the FY 2015 budget. Our organizations work daily with many vulnerable families who live and work in Alexandria. It will take both the public and private sectors, working together, to secure the resources critical to these working families and at-risk individuals in our community. We believe that strategic public investments in housing and human services can leverage significant amounts of private capital to provide an excellent return on the city's investment to maintain a viable and diverse community. The guiding principles that informed our decisions are as follows:

- No one recommendation takes priority over the others;
- Each recommendation funds a program that is an essential component of a system of housing and services that offer individuals and families in need the optimum chances for success;
- These recommendations support a wide spectrum of households along the housing continuum;
- No funding for new initiatives is requested. Instead, these recommendations fund coordinated efforts between housing and service providers to deliver critical safety net supports with maximum efficiency and adoption of best practices.

Our recommendations are as follows:

Healthy and Thriving Residents

Rental Subsidy Program

We support the City Manager's addition of \$240,000 for Senior/Disabled Rent Relief in the proposed budget. The current budget for rent relief is \$ 272,177, and has not changed since FY2007. This program supports approximately 80 households annually who are income-eligible elderly or disabled renters. The maximum subsidy will be capped at \$500/month, serving households that earn no more than \$25,600 annually. This funding will provide support for approximately 30 additional households.

Homeless Prevention Services

We request an addition of \$100,000 for Homeless Prevention Services in the proposed budget. This program has expended approximately \$293,000 YTD, and prevented 206 people from becoming homeless. While length of time for assistance varies, the average shelter costs for individuals are approximately \$3,800 per person compared to the average subsidy for homeless prevention of \$1,400 per person. Keeping families and individuals in their homes is clearly of greater benefit, and more cost effective. However, this program has run out of funding, and can no longer be strategic for providing prevention services. Therefore we urge additional funding for this program in FY2015.

Disposition of the Aspen and Grayson Properties

Two city-owned or city-financed properties used as transitional housing for eight CSB clients and clients dealing with substance abuse are no longer in use for those purposes, and the disposition of the properties is uncertain. As noted in the Housing Master Plan, "there is an unmet need of 795 affordable

housing units for persons with disabilities in Alexandria, and locating residential programs for CSB clients and/or homeless individuals is a community challenge.” Currently, however, there is neighborhood acceptance for these two facilities. As a result, we urge the Council to direct the City Manager and appropriate staff to work with nonprofits in the community to continue their use for residential programs focused on these hard-to-serve populations.

Alexandria Fund for Human Services

We respectfully request that the funding for the Alexandria Fund for Human Services (AFHS) for FY2015 be restored to the FY2014 level, increasing the City Manager’s proposed budget by \$111,829. A 5.5% decrease, following six consecutive years of level funding by the city, is a significant cut. City funds strengthen the ability of the nonprofit community to leverage private resources, in-kind donations, and volunteer hours from private citizens, the faith community, the business community, and foundations. This loss of funds will have a significant negative impact on programs delivered by our nonprofit organizations and, more importantly, those who are most vulnerable in our community.

JobLink Employment Services

We note the reduction in funding for employment services for adults through JobLink. Employment training and job placement are critical to the success of families and individuals to thrive and achieve greater self-sufficiency. However, this program was not helpful for many of the households we serve. We urge the city to support employment programs that address the challenges of very low income persons with high barriers to employment – language skills, life skills, basic educational deficiencies, criminal histories, etc. Initiatives that engage potential employers and community colleges with nonprofit organizations offer the best opportunities to train residents in the life and professional skills they need and place them in jobs. We would welcome the opportunity to work with city staff to explore new opportunities to address this goal.

Livable, Green and Prospering City

Homeownership

We support the City Manager’s addition of \$214,000 for five additional loans to low and moderate income Alexandria residents, noting that this is an increase above the four loans made in the last fiscal year. A key provision of the Housing Master Plan is to “provide and support affordable and workforce home purchase opportunities for Alexandria residents and workers.” We hope that a way can be found to support a housing counselor, either by the city or outsourced to a third party. This homeownership education involving all aspects of home purchase and financing is critical to successful homeownership by reducing the incidence of delinquent mortgage payments or foreclosures.

Affordable Housing and the Adopted Goal of 2,000 newly committed units by 2025

Securing decent, affordable housing in Alexandria remains one of the greatest challenges for low and moderate income households, many of whom are employed full-time. Consider the following statistics from the Housing Master Plan:

- Over 6,000 market affordable rental units lost from 2000 – 2010;
- Over 12,000 affordable ownership units lost to increased property values in the same period;
- The analysis of future housing needs shows a net deficit of approximately 15,000 units by 2030 for households earning at or below 60% of the area median income;
- The shortage of units in all bedroom sizes for households earning at or below 30% of area median income is approximately 3,500 units.

We applaud the Council’s unanimous approval of the Housing Master Plan, and adoption of the goal to preserve or build 2,000 units by 2025. Securing 800 units of committed affordable housing at Beauregard was a significant accomplishment, but given the tremendous documented need for housing that is affordable,

we urge the Council not to include these units - which were committed in 2012 - in the 2000 unit goal beginning in FY2015.

To support new construction or preservation of affordable rental housing, we urge City Council to consider a long-term, annual investment in housing which can leverage private funding to meet housing goals. The proposed FY15 Office of Housing budget provides a total of \$3.4 million available to develop or preserve new affordable rental housing, and increase the city's committed affordable housing stock. This breaks down into the following categories:

- Housing Trust Fund \$2,135,000
- Federal funding 833,980 (HOME funds)
- General fund 490,000 (.06 cents of real estate tax)

The majority of Housing Trust Fund monies is one time carryover funding from FY14, and 25 percent of this \$3.4 million allocation is federal funding which is declining. We appreciate the continued commitment of the .06 cents of the real estate tax, and would urge allocation of additional funding in FY2016 as federal dollars continue to shrink. As affordable housing developers seek opportunities in the city, they will need an annual, reliable source of public funding to leverage their financing and bridge the gap to provide rents to moderate income households. The proposed funding for FY2015 is barely adequate for a 50 unit development, and would not support additional development opportunities.

This coalition appreciates the significant budget challenges for FY2015, and thanks you for your commitment to address our concerns for those in our community who are homeless, elderly or disabled, or simply low and moderate income workers who struggle to keep up with the cost of living in Alexandria. We stand ready to work with you to maintain the critical safety net of services and make the city a safe and prosperous place for all Alexandrians, regardless of income or ability.

Dear Mayor, Vice-Mayor, and Council Members,

I know you are struggling with the budget while not increasing the tax rate. I think we all need to stop looking at the weeds and bushes and view the entire city service ecosystem. I am a senior and own my home. My assessment increased 10% this year, so I'll be paying a 10% increased property tax. While I have adequate retirement funds, many Alexandria seniors are house rich and income poor. We need an adjustment of the total assets qualification for reduced tax for seniors. That is, unless we expect some seniors to sell their houses and move away from their favorite town.

My greater concern is maintaining and improving services for our diverse population. I do not see a reduction in city staffing as a solution to keeping the tax rate fixed. I do not agree with the "do more with less, be more efficient philosophy." Long-time employees of Alexandria have worked for lower salaries and benefits than other area governments for many years; we are catching up, but not competitive and only about 10% for the employees live in the city. I do not think a RIF is needed at all. Do we expect employees over the age of 50 to find new jobs at the same pay? Have we become private sector corporate managers and plan to cheat those who have put in long careers and are nearing retirement or is there a plan to fully pay for RIF employee retirements?

The city embarked on a plan of priorities a few years ago. I do not see that we have fulfilled them; we need the staff to keep working on the plan. We have a plan for upgrading our parks, but we need better maintenance of the facilities we now use; and we will need more staff for improved facilities and programs. We have a growing residential population; we need more school facilities, fire and police services, and social and health services. This certainly means more staff, not less. And I don't think we need more contractors doing the work.

As we redevelop properties as higher cost housing, do we expect a decrease in cost of services to the displaced lower-income families? Do we expect new, higher income residents to wait for improved services until their property tax contributions catch up with the marginal cost increase for the services?

I think we need to get off the fixation on the tax rate bandwagon. We need to fund staffing for programs for Alexandria's citizens. How about "A Penny For Progress" as a new slogan for a one cent increase to the property tax rate?

In advance of the work session on Tuesday, I am writing on behalf of the Carlyle Council (CCC) to reiterate our opposition to food trucks in Carlyle. CCC represents commercial and residential property owners in the Carlyle Community – nearly 5 million square feet of commercial space, over 30 retail businesses and 1,700 residential units. CCC's concerns include:
 - food trucks can impede the streetscape aesthetic as well as contribute trash, exhaust fumes, noise and other environmental concerns;
 - Carlyle is home to two federal agencies that have security concerns that extend to the presence of food trucks (see PTO letter); and,
 - Carlyle properties are seeking to fill long-vacant retail space and efforts to attract new tenants would likely be hindered by food trucks creating a less robust retail environment.

I have attended most of the Food Truck Advisory Group meetings and it is clear that opponents outnumber supporters and food truck supporters are primarily from the food truck industry itself.

Our storefront restaurants have made a commitment to Carlyle and the City – they pay their taxes, are active in our Community in many ways and are an essential part of what Carlyle is about.

Attached you will find statements from Carlyle property owners, residents, tenants and businesses opposed to food trucks in Carlyle. While food trucks may have a place in Alexandria – in food deserts or for certain special events -- we do not see how food trucks, everyday would benefit the Carlyle Community.

My name is Patricia Gaston. I'm a resident and homeowner in Alexandria (Warwick Village) and I'm the chair of the Alexandria Marketing Fund Committee. The Alexandria Marketing Fund is a grant program providing seed money in the form of matching funds for new and innovative marketing programs. It is funded under the Livable, Green, and Prospering City focus area.

Our budget has been proposed to be reduced from \$135,000 in 2014 to \$50,000 in 2015 - a 63% reduction in our funding. I encourage you to reconsider this drastic cut in our funding, as it will negatively impact the city's thriving businesses.

I ask that you maintain our funding at FY14's level of \$135,000, or as close to FY14 levels as possible. I do understand needing to do more with less, but \$50,000 equates to less than a single application cycle – we usually have three. Maintaining a committee and coordinating council for a single application cycle per year is not an effective use of the committee or coordinating council's time, nor the city's. And cutting our funding this drastically will limit the impact the committee and coordinating council have with Alexandria small businesses and nonprofits.

I provide below a number of key points about this important fund.

Key points about this important fund and the Alexandria citizens who support it:

- * The fund's recipients are nonprofits or groups of small businesses who collaborate to achieve a common objective, whether it's promoting their businesses in general (like Del Ray Business Association's revamped website) or promoting a specific event or initiative (like the Alexandria Food and Wine Festival, or the Old Town Boutique District's effort to lure more holiday shoppers to Alexandria – rather than Tysons – by bringing Santa to Old Town).
- * These are matching funds. Our application requires all applicants tell us who their partners are, and how much they're contributing.
- * Some of our nonprofit recipients include Campagna Center, Torpedo Factory, and Carpenters Shelter. Small business group recipients have included Old Town Boutique District, Alexandria Food and Wine Festival, and countless ad hoc groups of Alexandria boutiques and other small businesses.
- * The Fund is administered by the Alexandria Marketing Fund Committee, who evaluates applications, provides written feedback to the applicants (via the coordinating council), and provides even more feedback and ideas

during in-person deliberation sessions.

* In short, the Committee is a group of volunteer professional communicators and marketers, selected for this committee for this expertise. We provide thousands of dollars of free consulting to Alexandria small businesses, helping them think through a marketing approach, their branding strategy, even who their partners are.

* The coordinating council – including Councilman Smedberg and representatives from the Office of Communications & Public Information – works with applicants, providing preliminary application review and feedback to them and to the Marketing Fund Committee. They are usually the first contact an applicant has with the fund and its process, and they are immensely helpful to applicants.

* We have an arduous evaluation process, recently revamped and automated.

* We evaluate applications for completeness, relevance to our stated goals and objectives, innovation and/or expansion of past efforts, ability to become a self-sustaining without Fund support, collaboration among participating groups, budget, quality of the overall marketing plan, quantifiable measures of success – what the applicant wishes to achieve, how they know they'll have achieved it, and exactly how they will measure it.

* Our process is transparent – every aspect of it is online, and our evaluation form aligns with the application

Dear Council Members:

Almost two years ago, the Alexandria Public Health Advisory Commission declared the exposure and potential exposure to secondhand smoke of our children and youth to be the greatest tobacco-related public health threat in the City of Alexandria.

City Council appropriately responded to the Commission's request for financial support on behalf of a Smoking Cessation and Secondhand Smoke Reduction Initiative within the affordable housing community. With the help of City funds, a partnership was forged between the Alexandria Redevelopment and Housing Authority (ARHA) and the Alexandria Coalition for Clean and Smoke Free Air to achieve two principal goals: (1) to work with the ARHA Board to adopt a non-smoking policy for the residents at ARHA; and (2) to expand the availability of comprehensive and affordable smoking cessation services to all residents who are interested in quitting.

We are pleased to learn that those two goals have been essentially achieved during the current fiscal year, and now we are asking Council to provide additional financial support to (a) ensure a smooth transition and timely implementation of the non-smoking policy; (b) provide a full year's experience with the newly created model system for delivering comprehensive cessation services to an expected increasing level of demand at ARHA; (c) encourage private owners of housing with Section 8 residents to adopt non-smoking policies consistent with the one adopted by the ARHA Board; and, (d) collect and analyze data necessary to measure the impact of the policy and cessation program on the incidence of smoking and incidence of disease related to secondhand smoke exposure.

We are convinced that a fully implemented non-smoking policy and a fully mature smoking cessation program at ARHA will make a significant contribution to not only the health and well-being of the residents and their immediate families, but also to the broader Alexandria community.

We hope we can rely on your support for this important investment in public health.

Proposed City Budget and Capital Improvement Program for FY 2015

Dear Mayor Euille and Members of Council:

On behalf of the Environmental Policy Commission (EPC), I am writing to share our comments regarding the proposed budget and capital improvement program for fiscal year 2015 for your consideration as you make your final adjustments.

Your support and the work of City staff have enabled Alexandria to compile several notable successes in environmental stewardship over the last several years. However, instead of abating, the environmental challenges and responsibilities the city faces are becoming more severe. Without a corresponding increase in investments in our environment, we will significantly increase the risk of environmental damages and large, unpredictable financial costs in years to come.

Since we commented on the development of the FY2015 budget and capital improvement program in November of last year, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) has released two major reports: one on climate change impacts, adaptation, and vulnerability; and another on mitigation of climate change. The introductory chapter for the report on the mitigation of climate change states that "[T]he scale of the mitigation challenge has grown enormously since 2007 due to rapid growth of the world economy and the continued lack of much overt effort to control emissions." The report also states that emissions are not on track for stabilization, let alone deep cuts, and that emissions from industrialized countries are largely unchanged from previous levels.

Following are specific recommendations and comments regarding the FY 2015 proposed city budget and capital improvement program.

Recycling activities: Several recycling activities were approved in FY 2014 using Contingent Reserves funding, including expanded public space recycling and food waste composting. Unfortunately, the proposed budget would stop these service expansions. We urge Council to adopt an increase in the residential refuse fee sufficient to allow continuation and expansion of all of the City's current recycling and waste reduction initiatives.

Transportation: We support the proposed budget's investments in transportation system improvements, and the continuation of the 2.2-cent real estate tax allocation toward this area. With this funding, as well as funding from the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority, the City can continue converting the DASH bus fleet to alternative fuel or low-emission vehicles, and continue development work on the Potomac Yard Metrorail Station.

Sanitary sewer and storm sewer infrastructure: We are concerned that the capital improvement program does not include funding for the costs associated with federally mandated infrastructure improvements to sanitary sewer and storm sewer systems. There will be large costs associated with the necessary infrastructure improvements over the coming years, and yet the budget proposes no increase in the sanitary sewer rate from the current level of \$1.25 per 1,000 gallons of wastewater treated. We believe the City should begin allocating resources to this project in FY 2015.

Open space: Alexandria will need to add an estimated 183 acres of open space over the next ten years in order to maintain the current ratio of 7.3 acres of open space per 1,000 residents. The capital improvement program does not include funding to address this need. Both planning and financial resources are needed to provide residents with access to open space in the years to come.

Energy management staffing: We strongly support establishing an additional staff position to focus on energy efficiency work on behalf of the City. The City's infrastructure, much of which has a useful lifetime measured in decades, establishes the parameters for the City's energy use, and consequently its emissions of greenhouse gases which are changing our climate. The City has a direct financial interest in minimizing its energy use, and a vitally important role to play in serving as a leader in energy efficiency initiatives in the community. Earlier this year, the EPC considered working with City staff to submit an application for the Georgetown University Energy Prize, which challenges local governments around the country to implement energy efficiency initiatives that lower residents' energy bills. Unfortunately, we were forced to conclude that Alexandria did not have sufficient staff to support participation. However, we understand that Arlington, which has several staff focused on sustainability efforts, will be participating. We urge Alexandria to follow Arlington's lead and add staff to help ensure that the City is able to capture cost effective energy efficiency savings.

We appreciate your continued commitment to Alexandria's Eco-City charter and to your support for policies and programs that make our City more sustainable.

I am writing as the Executive Director of Friends of Guest House, a member of the Alexandria Council of Human Services Organizations (ACHSO) and member of the Partnership to Prevent and End Homelessness in Alexandria. Guest House, as most of you know, provides transitional housing as well as Outreach services to women returning from incarceration. We have been located in Alexandria for over 40 years!

I send this letter to convey our interest in the Alexandria Fund for Human Services (AFHS).

We are asking that the funding for the Alexandria Fund for Human Services (AFHS) for FY2015 be restored to the fy2014 level, increasing the City Manager's proposed budget by \$111,829. A 5.5% decrease, following six consecutive years of level contribution by the City, is a significant cut. We understand that the City has increased personnel costs and the Manager seeks to meet these obligations. We, too, have increased personnel costs. The impact of a cut will be devastating to our nonprofit members and, more importantly, those we serve.

It will mean that some organizations must cut employees or hours thereby delivering fewer services to fewer Alexandrians. For others, which live on shoestring budgets while providing valuable services, the string will break. The City is requiring families in need to leave, while professing to have DIVERSITY, including affordable housing, as a goal. How do we define diversity? Is it about color, country of origin, language spoken, sexual orientation, age, income, level of education? The Alexandria City Council Strategic Plan (Plan) as revised in 2010 includes all of those. In fact, one objective includes reducing poverty by 10% by the year 2015 (yes, this year) by maintaining prevention services, not by reducing city support for those services.

Our ability to leverage private resources, in-kind donations, and volunteer hours means our City's residents have even more benefit because of the City's investment. We are employers of nearly 11% of the City's employees; we are good-will ambassadors; we are consumers; we are residents. Not only do we bring funding to the City, well in excess of the AFHS budget, but we also get a great deal of in-kind assistance from our business community. Your support gives credibility to your partners.

We understand that times are tough; we understand that you are reconsidering your method of distributing funds with a revised AFHS. But we don't understand why those funds are being reduced before implementing the next steps, doing harm to those most in need.

Please honor goal #4 of the Plan by supporting and enhancing the well-being, success and achievement of children, youth and families. We are a good investment for Alexandria.

We look forward to continuing our partnerships with the City to ensure that the most effective, efficient and critical services are delivered to our citizens. Thank you for your attention to these important issues.

Points For Consideration

1. Did the Rec. Dept. get input from the managers at the programs that will have to endure the repercussions of the proposed RIFs, in an effort to evaluate the best possible scenario for reductions?

2. In determining the best possible scenario for proposed reductions, reducing staff from direct service locations and programs will have a greater negative impact on those in the community who are in most need of recreation services. This will this have a greater negative impact, on the Alexandria Community?

3. What message is being sent to the Alexandria Community in need of these services, and the longtime employees being affected by this RIF? A mass RIF like this, put into effect without evaluating the worth of the employees rendering these services to the Alexandria Community, sends a very negative message. Not only is the community deemed not important, but those employees who have rendered a valuable service to the community for many years are deemed equally as unimportant, when they are looked at as just a number and not valuable asset to the City, both individually and collectively. That is the same as looking at them as convicted felons with just a number.

3. Since there have been additional management positions added to the Department budget over the past years, and/or money redirected for use in this manner, why was this not evaluated in terms of the overall negative effect of these budget cuts on the community? Reductions in some of these upper management positions would not only have less affect on direct services to the community, it would also affect fewer staff (numbers), as these reductions at much higher salaries would require eliminating far fewer positions to meet the reduction quotas. Treating staff and the community with respect and as valued employees also sends a positive message in three ways:

- It is important to continue trying to meet the needs of the Alexandria Citizens in need of these services.
- The jobs and services rendered by longtime Alexandria employees is important to Alexandria City Government.
- Those who labor in the fields are as important as those who work in management.

Treatment of lower level staff with a lack of respect and value for their positions sends a message that the City is operating with a slave mentality, particularly when those negatively affected are predominantly minorities.

4. It would appear that if RIFs are absolutely necessary to meet the budget reductions, and this also seems questionable, the best scenario would be to determine what would have the least negative affect on the Alexandria Community that is in most need of recreational services. Maintaining excessive managerial positions and reducing direct service positions is definitely and obviously not the solution to this problem. Isn't this akin to

"the rich getting richer and the poor getting poorer?"

I am writing in strong support of much of the proposed FY 2015 budget support of the Alexandria Public Library system. In particular, the inclusion of additional funding for custodial services at the Beatley Central Library is most welcome. However, the \$30,000 reduction in the materials budget should be of concern to us all. As you know, Alexandria has a reciprocal agreement with both Arlington and Fairfax County library systems. In my experience over the last 40 or so years of active local library use, the collections of both of those systems is far more extensive than that of Alexandria. Please note also that the materials budget has not increased since FY 2006! Thus, I urge that the funding be restored.

I commend the City Manager and the City Council for the ongoing support for resolution of the serious water intrusion problems at Beatley. While there is no doubt that considerable improvement has occurred, it is worth noting that there was significant water intrusion during the last heavy rainstorm at one point where significant intrusion as previously occurred. Your continued interest in and support of the resolution of this serious matter is urged.

Finally, I would observe that it the Alexandria Public Library system is a fundamental component of support for minority and low income groups, and constitutes an important supplementary resource for the challenges faced by students in the Alexandria Public Schools. As a retired, relatively affluent, white male voter, I personally don't really need the Alexandria Public Library system; if local libraries do not have a book or item that I want, I can simply purchase it for myself. However, many of those in minority and low income groups cannot do so. I also have the high-speed internet connections that are often lacking in the homes of the less affluent. Thus, when library services are cut, these cuts tend to affect the poorest Alexandria residents most acutely. Please bear these thoughts in mind when considering the FY 2015 budget.

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Senior Services of Alexandria (SSA), we are writing to express concern about proposed cuts to the Alexandria City budget which will have an unfair and unprecedented negative impact on the most vulnerable seniors in our community.

Since 1968, SSA has helped Alexandria's seniors age with independence, self-sufficiency and dignity. The proposed changes to the Real Estate Tax Relief Program for the Elderly and Persons with Disabilities and the total elimination of the Senior Taxi Program are in stark contrast to the well-planned goals of the Strategic Plan on Aging, which was approved by City Council in 2012. Housing and transportation were identified as key areas of importance, and critical to this is the Plan's objective to support in certain instances older Alexandria residents' desire to live their remaining years in their homes and community.

The steep cuts in property tax relief for elderly, lower-income homeowners will force many to abandon their homes in order to meet their other and basic essential needs to maintain their respect and dignity. Moreover, the Senior Taxi Program, whose budget was already halved just this past year, provides safe and reliable transportation for nearly 400 income-qualified residents, who use it primarily for medical appointments.

Because it appears that the potentially affected homeowners and Senior Taxi Program participants have not been notified of the proposed changes, before the budget cuts are indiscriminately applied we ask that further consideration be given to these issues.

While we recognize that City Council shoulders a heavy burden in adopting a fiscally responsible budget, it should renew and not undermine its past commitment to Alexandria's less fortunate seniors, particularly those with very limited resources.

We welcome the opportunity to sit down and discuss a compassionate and fiscally responsible strategy for the foreseeable future.

The Alexandria Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Council, established pursuant to Title 2, Chapter 4, Article J, of the Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia functions to advise the city council with respect to the provision of training to emergency rescue technicians, including training to enable such personnel to progress to coronary care technicians with appropriate technical capabilities; the acquisition of appropriate therapeutic and record keeping equipment to correspond with the level of training and expertise of emergency rescue technicians; the provision of a medical communications network which may fit into a regionalized plan; applications to various grant sources for funding for planning and implementation of the emergency medical services program; disaster planning, including arrangements for communications and assistance with neighboring communities, coordination with local hospitals, and provisions of a disaster vehicle with appropriate supplies and communications and other equipment; and such other matters as the city council or the city manager may refer to the council, or the council, with the concurrence of the manager, may consider on its own initiative.

In fulfillment of these functions, the EMS Council met on April 14, 2014 to review the section of the "City Manager's Proposed Fiscal Year 2015 Operating Budget and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)" that specifically impacts pre-hospital emergency medical care in our city and surrounding areas. At this meeting, the acting Fire Chief, Fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Operations Manager, Operational Medical Director, and representatives from the International Association of Fire Fighters Local 2141 and Alexandria Medics Association provided testimony to the Council on the potential impact of the reductions and reallocations affecting Fire/EMS.

Evaluating these testimonies and discussions during this meeting; appreciating the fiscal challenges and the plethora of decisions faced by the city manager, members of city council, and department heads; and respecting the input process of the city's taxpayers, employees, and stakeholders, the EMS Council advises the following:

- 1) The Alexandria emergency pre-hospital medical care delivery system comprises of hospitals, physicians, nurses, fire fighter-emergency medical technicians, medics, fire marshals, and emergency call dispatchers. Each component of the system contributes greatly to providing excellent care for the citizens, employees and visitors of Alexandria. As such, additions, reductions and/or reallocations of any component of the system directly impact the effectiveness of the entire system.
- 2) The EMS Council supports preserving and maintaining current staffing levels in Fire/EMS as it fulfills the plan to open the new Station 210. As such, every effort should be made to commit funding from the FY15 Budget and CIP to Fire/EMS and refrain from eliminating currently assigned resources.
- 3) The “peak time” medic unit (Medic 204) currently staffed between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. should continue operating as such through June 30, 2014. On July 1, 2014 that medic unit should join the fleet of full time medic units as Medic 210 and should run out of Station 204. At the completion of construction of Station 210, Medic 210 should be housed at that new station.


As advocates and consumers of the exemplary pre-hospital care delivered by Alexandria’s Fire and Emergency Medical Services personnel, the members of the EMS Council are keenly aware of the resources needed to recruit and retain talented emergency medical caregivers, maintain safe and reliable stations and a fleet of specialty vehicles and ambulances, or “medic units,” and continue to educate and train a highly skilled professional workforce. We also know that the taxpayers, employees and visitors of Alexandria rely on, and appreciate, nothing less.

Alexandria Fund for Human Services (AFHS).

PR S provides skills training and supports so individuals living with mental
illness, substance use disorders, mild intellectual disabilities, autism
spectrum disorders or any combination of these achieve wellness, recovery
and community integration. Thanks to a generous grant from the City of
Alexandria Fund for Human Services – Community Partnership fund, over
the past two years we have provided highly-individualized training and
support services to Carpenter’s Shelter / David’s Place clients who are not
covered by Medicaid. Services, which are delivered onsite in clients’
residences or in the community, help build independent living skills and the
ability to manage symptoms so that clients can attain and retain stability,
and make progress toward recovery goals.

Thus, we are asking that the funding for the AFHS for FY2015 be restored
to the FY2014 level, increasing the City Manager’s proposed budget by
\$111,829. A 5.5% decrease, following six consecutive years of level
contribution by the City, is a significant cut. We understand that the City
has increased personnel costs and the Manager seeks to meet these

With last years estimated \$2M Healthcare saving overhaul, changes were made to City employee's healthcare benefits. One of the changes is a mandate that I receive medications (after the 3rd refill) through mail order, rather than a local pharmacy of choice. If the medication by mail order option is not used, I must pay full retail cost for the medication. This change to the healthcare benefits structure saves the City an mere estimated \$105K. I am asking the City Council to rescind this change to the employee benefits plan for the following reasons:

1. This mandate is costing the City businesses revenue.

Like most of my fellow employees, I cannot afford to pay full retail cost for a medication so I have been forced to get my medications my mail order. Now a regular mandatory visit to my local pharmacy or grocery store to acquire medications no longer happens. How many times have I gone into my local pharmacy and spent \$45 instead of just the \$15 that I needed to spend on meds because I purchased a loaf of bread, milk, batteries, lip balm and a box of tissue? How may City employees use local Alexandria pharmacies or other businesses to get their medications? Because of this new meds by mail order mandate, I assure you that this number has decreased. Over the course of a year or three years, how much revenue is lost because City employees no longer are able to go the local store for meds? I imagine this loss in local revenue exceeds \$105K per year in Alexandria alone.

2. Mail Order pricing is more expensive for employees.

The mail order price structure charges employees for a 90 day supply of medication even if the prescription is written for 30 days or less. This was not an advertised detail of the benefits plan. I have personally experienced this increase in cost. Not all doctors write prescriptions for 90 days depending on the medical conditions being addressed. The advertised \$15 prescription cost on my benefits card became null and void after my 3rd refill.

3. Speedy Access to Medications:

I have a son with chronic asthma. I do my utmost best to keep adequate supplies of his medication on hand at all times. If he is having a flare-up and I anticipate that he will need more meds than what we have on hand at home, I can call the pharmacy and/or the pediatrician and there is another prescription waiting for pickup at the local pharmacy within hours. Working closely with his pediatrician and having the ability to get more medication quickly has saved our family from having traumatic and expensive visits to the ER. Forcing me to acquire medications by mail is limiting our ability to care for our child. So far receiving medications in the mail has taken 3 days or more, not hours. I fear that the lack of speedy access to the medications will lead to an increased number of ER visits.

In the end and with respect to you, the City Council, \$105K is a small price to pay to boost economic welfare, lower costs for employees and restoring the ability for employees to manage their own healthcare.

This e-mail is on behalf of the Alexandria Law Library. As the Council enters its Add/Delete budget deliberations, the Board of Directors of the Alexandria Law Library wanted to thank you for your willingness to consider continued funding for the Alexandria Law Library.

The Law Library Board understands that this is a difficult budget year. However, the Board believes that the Law Library provides a vital service and is essential to the ability of the Alexandria citizenry to have meaningful access to justice.

Many proposals are being considered concerning the long-term plans for the Law Library. Unfortunately, none of these plans can be implemented before the City's fiscal 2015 budget becomes operative. The Law Library cannot continue without City support. The Law Library can, however, survive in the short-term with a reduction in City support.

Even if the City cannot reinstate full funding for the Law Librarian position for the 2015 fiscal year, we request that the City retain the full time Law Librarian position at the current salary and level of benefits. The full time Law Librarian position could be funded by reinstating City funding of \$75,000 and using a portion of the \$56,000 filing fee income to cover the remaining costs of the Law Librarian compensation. The Law Library would address its remaining fiscal needs through fundraising and Bar Association support.

While this approach is not a long-term solution, it will keep the Law Library open in fiscal 2015 and allow the Law Library, the City, the Bar Association and the Courts to develop a long-term strategy under the budgetary constraints.

- Request Description: Letter from a Birmingham Jail was written on this day in 1963 by Martin Luther King. In it he says: Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. I believe there is an injustice being done to some of our social services in Alexandria, by balancing the budget at the expense of human service programs that help many in our community. Mayor Euille was quoted on WAMU's morning edition as saying "offering services is not cheap." This is true, but some of the services the city helps support are essential to its citizens, and are services that are not supported by development or a larger commercial tax base. In fact, they are services that only with the help of government will likely continue. They have a direct positive benefit, even if it is hard to calculate their financial return.

Some of the services I am aware that the city is cutting or reducing are the Senior Taxi program (\$164,000), the Law Library (\$121,000) and funding for the Northern Virginia Juvenile Detention Home (\$100,000) and The Concerned Citizens Network of Alexandria for After School tutoring (\$20,000), which is being told to apply to the Alexandria Fund for Human Services for funding. By the way, this fund is being decreased by \$112,000. Other cuts include the one part time and one full time position from the court Services Unit and a \$25,000 contribution to Sheltercare. Approximately \$200,000 is being eliminated from Adult Mental Health and substance abuse, including the elimination of a motivational treatment program and reducing a full time therapist in the detention center to a part time therapist. This is a very important to our community and helps many people who have no other avenue for help, including one of my childhood friends.

There are also cuts of \$25,000 for the Regional Dental Clinic. I have known a couple individuals whose only dental service comes from this clinic. One lived in a Single Room Occupancy, and since through the voucher program has moved to Hunting Towers. Another was a homeless man who I offered to buy a bagel, but he said he had just had his teeth pulled. There probably is not an option for him to get teeth ever again, except for possibly dentures. It is these type of people who depend on city services for basic dental care. There are also cuts to an early childhood training specialist. JobLink is also being gutted and reduced by \$367,000 in funding. Also, distressing to read is the elimination of tow part time nurses at the Teen Health Clinic at TC Williams. As the parent of a TC Williams Student this is particularly surprising as this provides pregnancy prevention, health awareness and other services free to students of our only high school.

In contrast to the cuts are increases in planning and development including nearly \$350,000 for the Department of Project Implementation. Sure, implementation has been problematic as the city passes plan but does not have the staff or ability to follow through. Half of this money is being provided through a TIF, but the other half is being funded by the city and both are being born by the general fund. There is also an increase of approximately \$650,000 in Human resources, which appears to be for various improvements but should be more fully explained, or reduced to fund human services. I think the same could be said for Information Technology Service that are increasing by \$757,000 and include \$80,000 for "Provision of professional services for Mobile Device support will improve security operations by augmenting existing staff resources to allow for timely and secure deployment and management of smart phones/ tablet devices." I think that this is somewhere a cut could be made so we don't have to cut dental services or mental health services. A public resource like the law library (121,000) could be continued to be funded with reductions in either of these 2 departments.

Ironically, there is a significant increase in the office of performance and accountability of \$161,000 for "Increase current levels of service delivery with personnel-related increases in funding for health coverage, salaries, and other fringe benefits, including the addition of 1.0 FTE Performance Analyst." Who is accountable for this office? I would cut this increase.

I am generally supportive of increases in Planning and Zoning, an area where the city needs more staff and professional development, especially in historic preservation, but perhaps some cuts like an extra \$50,000 for consultant services and the 82,000 new position for development review. This should be funded through developer contributions, not the general fund, and I thought that the Beauregard plan included funding for staff to work with the development of that area. I am also supportive of increasing the budget for preventative maintenance of city buildings in the General Services budget, but perhaps we could eliminate the \$43,000 for added security at city hall as a luxury we cannot afford right now. I also question the extra real estate specialist for disposing of city property, as two of the properties, the Health Department and the Elder Crafters building on Cameron St. have already been disposed of or are in process. That is a \$72,000 position. I would swap this with the homeland security detective as the elimination of this position "will result in reduced capacity to provide timely intelligence, to investigate terrorism related incidents, and to coordinate efforts with the Northern Virginia Regional Intelligence Center, as well as other City partners (Fire, Sheriff, Human Rights, etc.) in responding to terrorist threats." Domestic violence is unfortunately still a major problem and reducing funding for a domestic violence family services specialist. Eliminates follow up and social work services to victims in non-arrest cases. Domestic violence intervention efforts in these cases may be eliminated/significantly reduced or will require the services of the Department of Community and Human Services or other City departments". Reduce overtime budget for internal investigations (\$2500). Reduces internal investigation services and diminishes staff's ability to respond to crime/major incident scenes during non-work hours to investigate allegations of police misconduct. Reduce overtime for public information officers. Eliminates PIO staff's capacity to respond during non-work hours and decreases timeliness of media releases. (\$6,334) These last two are rather small amounts which hopefully can be fully restored.

This budget also compromises public safety. Take the elimination of a public information officer which "may result in delayed communication between the Fire Department and the Office of Communications and Public Information during large scale incidents." Or the moving of a fire engine to station 210 which "may result in slightly increased response times on the City's east side but will decrease response times on the City's west side where the demand for service is higher." The east side of the city has more older houses, presumably with less built in fire prevention systems, so taking away a water truck from an area where water is essential to fighting fires may be costly. Along with the elimination of 10 vacant firefighter positions also includes "Additional savings will be realized by not purchasing radios and self-contained breathing apparatus within the CIP." I imagine not purchasing new radios will also be a detriment to public safety and the safety of first responders. In addition, this budget proposes to eliminate a peak time medic unit that handled 750 calls last year, 3 fire Marshalls and 2 Emergency management positions that "may result in reduced planning and training for emergency events." This is a lot of risk to take, especially as Alexandria, being located next to DC, and having a Federal Court House, has had to handle many emergency situations and incidents. Also, cuts of \$886,000 of cuts also go to the Sheriff's department, with one deputy position eliminating the ability of the Sheriff's department to help with city clean-up. (\$68,092)

It also compromises our parks with total reductions of \$980,000. This includes reduction in overtime and contracting services which may be entirely necessary, but also includes maintenance, mowing and only providing flowers in front of city hall, but no other planting in the rest of the city. There is a decrease of four urban forestry positions, and reductions in school grounds maintenance but especially disturbing, in light of the push for the waterfront plan is the reduction of Waterfront Maintenance (\$19,953) the item says "Waterfront Operations: Reduce and defer site maintenance activities in Waterfront Parks. Will increase days between mowing cycles and reduce plantings. Department will attempt to fill gap through increased volunteer services." I have not heard of any effort to engage volunteers and I would request that this money be left in the budget until a volunteer organization is in place. I would fund this by eliminating this year the "Funding for professional services to allow the department to collaborate with artists and arts organizations." (\$21,448) I also think printing of a new bike map (\$20,000) could be eliminated. There are Apps and other ways to get bike routes besides print materials. It would be better to develop an on-line bike navigation system.

Lastly, I would eliminate the \$74,241 that is proposed for Leadership & Management Support. This is for "The addition of 1.0 FTE for Civic Engagement/Public Communications, is anticipated to improve communications service for the City, including more robust website management, outreach, public meeting presence, and adherence to the City's Principles of Civic Engagement." Leadership is the job of city council, who we elected to be our leaders. Unfortunately it seems like there is not the time, or concern to look more closely at the severe cuts to human services, parks, safety and other things that should be a concern to citizens. Perhaps this is because they have to defer to a City Manager who makes more than 5 times as much and has a staff of 7 to assist him. I would suggest taking this 74,000 and adding 10,000 to the salary of each city council member, and in exchange, each council member would have to have their office open three hours a week to citizens. This could be on

evenings and weekends or even staffed by aides for those that work full time. This would better balance the role of council and manager. I would then take the \$46,752 the manager has proposed to increase his own office, and distribute it to the council aides, so that they will have the financial ability to give their time to better serve citizens. This is being considered in the same budget that the city manager recommends increasing his own salary %6.6, or \$16,420, to a total of \$263,870. I urged the city Council in a letter to the editor to delay hiring a new city manager till after the last Council Elections, but clearly that would have made no difference, especially if this council approves this salary increase when they are repeatedly telling the public that we are in tight economic times where we have to watch our budgets. I also wrote a letter about the city managers salary when he was hired. In fact, everyone in the City Manager's office is being given an increase, for a total of\$ 46,752. As Martin Luther King said in his letter, "Lamentably, it is an historical fact that privileged groups seldom give up their privileges voluntarily." It is up to City Council to curb the salary of the city manager. Martin Luther King spoke out in support of the oppressed against the ruling majority. He fought for economic justice. It is remarkable that when economic disparity is a part of our national conversation, and our Democratic President is fighting to correct this disparity by providing health care for all and raising the minimum wage, our Democratic City Council is considering a budget that increases our ability to help development, while decreasing the services we provide to those with the least ability to provide for themselves. This seems out of order.

I do not believe there is the necessary tension between policy and implementation of priorities through the budget. MLK believed that this tension created the opportunity to negotiate. "Just as Socrates felt that it was necessary to create a tension in the mind so that individuals could rise from the bondage of myths and half truths to the unfettered realm of creative analysis and objective appraisal, so must we see the need for nonviolent gadflies to create the kind of tension in society that will help men rise from the dark depths of prejudice racism to the majestic heights of understanding and brotherhood." Instead of negotiation all I hear is defense of this budget, and not creative solutions to funding. MLK also said that "We must use time creatively, in the knowledge that the time is always ripe to do right. Now is the time to make real the promise of democracy and transform our pending national elegy into a creative psalm of brotherhood. Now is the time to lift our national policy from the quicksand of racial injustice to the solid rock of human dignity." Translate that to the injustices done by this budget, and use your time to think creatively about how we can put the budget back in a more just balance. And if there was ever a time for protest, this is it.

I am writing as a board member PRS, Inc. (Psychiatric Rehabilitation Services), a member of the Alexandria Council of Human Services Organizations (ACHSO) to request no cut in funding for the Alexandria Fund for Human Services (AFHS).

PRS provides skills training and supports so that individuals living with mental illness, substance use disorders, mild intellectual disabilities, autism spectrum disorders or any combination of these achieve wellness, recovery and community integration. Thanks to a generous grant from the City of Alexandria Fund for Human Services – Community Partnership fund, over the past two years we have provided highly-individualized training and support services to Carpenter's Shelter / David's Place clients who are not covered by Medicaid. Services, which are delivered onsite in clients' residences or in the community, help build independent living skills and the ability to manage symptoms so that clients can attain and retain stability, and make progress toward recovery goals.

We are asking that the funding for the Alexandria Fund for Human Services (AFHS) for FY2015 be restored to the fy2014 level, increasing the City Manager's proposed budget by \$111,829. A 5.5% decrease, following six consecutive years of level contribution by the City, is a significant cut. We understand that the City has increased personnel costs and the Manager seeks to meet these obligations. We, too, have increased personnel costs. The impact of a cut will be devastating to our nonprofit members and, more importantly, those we serve.

It will mean that some organizations must cut employees or hours thereby delivering fewer services to fewer Alexandrians. For others, which live on shoestring budgets while providing valuable services, the string will break. The City is requiring families in need to leave, while professing to have DIVERSITY, including affordable housing, as a goal. How do we define diversity? Is it about color, country of origin, language spoken, sexual orientation, age, income, level of education? The Alexandria City Council Strategic Plan (Plan) as revised in 2010 includes all of those. In fact, one objective includes reducing poverty by 10% by the year 2015 (yes, this year) by maintaining prevention services, not by reducing city support for those services.

Our ability to leverage private resources, in-kind donations, and volunteer hours means our City's residents have even more benefit because of the City's investment.

We understand that times are tough; we understand that you are reconsidering your method of distributing funds with a revised AFHS. But we don't understand why those funds are being reduced before implementing the next steps, doing harm to those most in need.

Please honor goal #4 of the Plan by supporting and enhancing the well-being, success and achievement of children, youth and families. We are a good investment for Alexandria.

We look forward to continuing our partnerships with the City to ensure that the most effective, efficient and critical services are delivered to our citizens. Thank you for your attention to these important issues.

- Request Description: I am writing you regarding the proposed changes to the real estate tax relief program for the senior citizens of Alexandria. I would like to share my father's story with you because I think he is representative of some of the longtime residents of this city.

Like his parents and grandparents before them, my 77 year old father has lived in the City of Alexandria his entire life. He has lived at his current residence in Rosemont since 1967. The value of the house at that time was \$32,000. For most of his adulthood my father worked for Eastern Airlines. After Eastern went out of business in 1991, my father struggled to find work with a comparable salary and my mother became the primary wage earner. Unfortunately, she became ill a few years later and died in 2003 at age 61. My father worked until he was 70 but is no longer able to work because he is disabled. This has left my father house rich and otherwise poor.

I recently helped him refinance his house in order to get money to finally pay off the medical bills that remained from my mother's illness. In this way my father is luckier than some. He would have been unable to get any money out of his house if he didn't have me to cosign the loan. We only removed enough to cover the outstanding credit card debt in order to make it possible for him to have a monthly budget that would be in the black. The real estate relief program is the only way that his budget is manageable on his very limited fixed income. If he loses this benefit, he will be running a deficit every month. It is his wish to remain in the home in which he raised his family but that may not be possible if you change this program. He currently owes about \$335,000 on the house the City estimates is worth \$901,000.

It saddens me to think that seniors who have called Alexandria home their entire lives have to spend their final years worrying about how they will remain in their homes. Frankly, I question our recent priorities when the local news is dominated by bike lanes, boathouses and increased density residential properties.

Dear Mayor, Vice Mayor, and City Council Members:

I believe in the importance of government. However, I also believe that in return for the taxes I pay, I should receive, at minimum, essential public safety services—falling into what the City has called its goals of “Safe, Just, and Secure.” Unless the Council acts to restore sufficient funds to keep Fire Engine 204 and its firefighters in place, I do not believe this basic standard will be met.

The City Manager, Rashad Young, has stated “Our new budget philosophy focuses on where money is spent and goes back to the basic question: what is government supposed to provide?” Emergency Fire suppression and medical service is one of the basic purposes for government, and I urge the City Council to vote to sustain the same level of these services with the same response times that our community currently has. I also urge the City Council members to listen to the firefighters who really understand firsthand how the overall Fire Department response works in the City; listening to the firefighters' vast and up-to-date knowledge is a good business practice and prudent way to manage. Listen to the firefighters when they say that removal of Engine 204 from Powhatan Street will spread the overall Fire Department response in the City more thinly and will not balance and improve these services City wide. Engines within the City currently patrol each other's area when another Engine comes into their area—they have each other “backs” and never leave an area of the City unprotected; if the City Council approves removal of the firefighters who operate Engine 204, areas of the City in my community will not be adequately covered and are at increased risk of negative outcomes. And finally listen to the firefighters who understand that the East Side of the City has lower water pressure (or if you prefer to describe it as the Interim Fire Chief called it “lower capacity”) and therefore has a need for more engines to pump water to counteract this problem. I believe the firefighters – our community had a fire where pressure/capacity was an issue and five cars in a parking lot burned instead of just one. I can't even use soaker hoses for watering my garden because the water never reaches the end of the hose due to these water pressure/capacity issues.

I'm also extremely disappointed that that the City Manager is disseminating unreliable and poorly supported figures relating to the current available response times. The Fire Department has stated in writing that their “model and measurement is imperfect.” The City Manager apparently agrees with this assessment and has requested that a comprehensive study of equipment and personnel in relation to call volume, call types, and other factors be conducted over a two-year period. Common sense and logic says that it would not be prudent to move any engines until proper data is obtained for sound decision-making.


Furthermore, if you look at the attached maps provided by the Fire Department to the NorthEast Citizens' Association, it is easy to see that Stations 201, 205, and 209 have response times in the relatively good range of yellow and green. The area surrounding Station 204 “as is” currently shows relatively poor response times using the colors of mostly orange and red, and these response times become more red or much slower when Engine 204 is removed. Clearly, if these maps are in any way valid, the safety of citizens in our community will be placed at significantly greater risk. I strongly urge you to restore the firefighters necessary to place fully staffed engines in both Stations 204 and 210 and do no harm to our community. Seconds count and lives matter!



Dear Mayor Euille and Members of the City Council:

I am greatly concerned that the City Manager's proposed budget will diminish opportunities for older residents to continue to live independently in Alexandria. I know that you have already received testimony from the Commission on Aging along with their FY2015 Budget Fact Sheet so I ask that you refer to their specific dollar impact analysis.

The proposed establishment of an overall cap of \$575,000 for eligibility for tax relief, a cap that includes all assets plus the value of the home, is not supportable and can potentially drive older residents out of the city. What might appear to some as retention of a generous level of assets that would allow for payment of full real estate assessments along with retirement living expenses is, I assure you, misleading. It does not take into account the significant out of pocket expenses like home and auto repair and uninsured medical and medically related expenses

The Senior Taxi program must be retained. I also serve as a member of the board of directors of At Home in Alexandria, a group of volunteers who help neighbors remain independent in the community. Transportation assistance to medical appointments is the most frequently requested service. Full fare taxi services add significant amounts to already overburdened senior budgets and para transit simply does not work for complicated and frequently changing medical appointment needs.

I urge you to retain the position supporting the JobLink senior employment specialist. The city should consider fine-tuning this position so that unemployed seniors can be brought up to date, not just for matches to available jobs, but for instruction in alignment and marketing of their skill in the newly competitive social network employment systems.

Finally, you need to add \$36,000 to support guardianship for those currently on the waiting list. I know friends and family who think they will never need this kind of assistance. We always hope that our longer lives will always allow for full independence in decision making. That is not always true. Many older people struggle with decisions relating to medication and personal health management. The struggle is sometimes lost. As older citizens struggle in dire and life threatening circumstances the case becomes stronger and stronger for increasing guardianship support.

Thank you for the opportunity to make these comments. I look forward to working constructively on these and other issues during my term on the Alexandria Commission on Aging.

Civics and Citizenship, our 10-week, after-school program, highlights the benefits and importance of active civic participation through hands-on learning activities. While on field trips to police and fire stations, city hall, the courthouse, and non-profit agencies, our participants learn how participatory democracy functions in the United States, an experience reinforced by visits with elected representatives at the local, state, and national level. In fact, of you seven, five have either visited our program or hosted our youth in your offices. In addition, guest speakers, who frequently come from immigrant families or are immigrants themselves, attend on-site sessions to talk with our youth about volunteerism, professional excellence, scholarship opportunities, and opportunities for personal growth and success. Speakers from this past semester alone have included professionals from the City of Alexandria, the Esperanza Scholarship Fund, George Mason University, and the Washington Redskins.

Opportunities Plus is our year-round professional internship program, which places documented, immigrant youth in eight-week internships with small businesses, government agencies, and nonprofits throughout the City. *Opportunities Plus* familiarizes adolescents with and helps them adjust to professional work environments. They develop skills that are necessary to thrive in the work place, such as time management, customer service skills, taking initiative, and communicating with super-

visors and colleagues. To ensure that financial hardship does not prevent our youth from participating, we provide a \$100/week allowance to cover food and transportation expenses.

This past fall we implemented a new program at T.C. Williams called *Civic Engagement for Beginning English Language Learners (CE-BELL)*, a modified version of our *Civics and Citizenship* after-school program. *CE-BELL* is explicitly designed for this steadily growing population of low-level (I-II), Spanish-speaking ELL students. *CE-BELL* reaches these students by teaching civic education in Spanish with a modest English-Language-Learning component. The main goal of *CE-BELL* is to help youth access opportunities for success and become active members of their community. By meeting with guest speakers who have experienced similar challenges as immigrants, they realize that they, too, can overcome their obstacles. *CE-BELL* creates a positive environment in which young people feel like they can try, a safe space where they can realize that learning English is a real possibility for them, and, thereby, opportunities to succeed are also within their reach.

CE-BELL has already engaged more than 50 Hispanic youth at T.C. Williams. At the beginning of the spring program, just five weeks ago, when guest speakers asked students what they wanted to study in the future, most students answered that they didn't know or hadn't given it any thought. Many said they were not planning to go to college since they had to work to earn a living. Now, they have changed their mind about attending college and can proudly articulate their goals to the entire class. One student even mentioned that he had never been so encouraged about his future and the opportunities that are available to him.

Liberty's Promise has been working at T.C. Williams High School since the 2009-10 school year. We have received \$30,000 over the past three years from the Alexandria Youth Fund to serve the low-income, immigrant youth of the City. As it is, the expenses necessary to run these programs far exceed the level of funding we receive from the City; further cuts would inhibit our ability to implement our programs successfully. We believe that the non-profit organizations in the City of Alexandria play a vital role in the positive development and achievement of the city's youth and citizens. The ACHSO report available to you speaks for itself. We would therefore request that the Alexandria City Council votes to support the Fund for Human Services at last year's funding level. Without the work that is done through the non-profits of this community, the City would face a substantial increase in the cost required to address the needs of all its residents. In that case, you would be faced with the necessity of implementing a radical increase in taxes or accept a significant decline in the quality of life for many of your citizens.

We look forward to continuing our partnership with the City to ensure that the most effective, efficient, and critical services are delivered to the youth of our community.

Times are tough time for the elderly in Alexandria. Costs keep going up and up, and it is getting harder and harder to make ends meet. The City Manager's proposed FY15 budget would make the situation even worse by trying to balance the books on the backs of our low-income seniors. I urge you to reject the proposed cuts to vital programs and adopt the common sense changes proposed by the Commission on Aging.

The first proposal is to undo the misguided proposal to eliminate Senior Taxi, which helps seniors get to the doctor, pharmacy, and grocery store. Without the program, many of our friends and neighbors will not be able to get the care they need. And eliminating Senior Taxi may not even save the city much money because some seniors will be forced to rely on other, more expensive programs.

Second, City Council should reject the proposed changes to real estate tax relief program for low income seniors and those with disabilities. Many of the people eligible for the program have lived in Alexandria for years, and their home values have risen year-after-year. That has led to ever increasing property taxes, even though their incomes have stayed flat. Without continued relief from the growing tax burden, many of our friends and neighbors will be forced to choose between paying their taxes or filling their prescriptions.

Finally, the City Council should give a helping hand to seniors facing hard times. For example, the city should retain the Older Worker Employment Specialist at JobLink to help unemployed seniors find gainful employment and ensure there is adequate funding to provide guardians for individuals who can no longer take care of themselves.

There is no question that we are facing some difficult choices this year, but Alexandria has always been a community that cares about its seniors and takes great pride in being able to help those in need. I ask for your help in ensuring that the final budget reflects our commitment to the elderly, particularly those with limited financial resources.

Regarding the removal of the fire engine from Fire Station 204, that particular fire truck is the only one in that station that carries water. In that part of town many of the fire hydrants have low water pressure, which exacerbates the risks of removing the only fire truck that carries water.

Moreover the density in that part of town is rapidly increasing due: to the rapid expansion of development in Potomac Yard; the growing demand for residential (especially high rise condos and apartment buildings) and business development in the neighborhoods in the Northeast, in North Old Town, along Washington Street, and along route one all the way down past the Bradock metrostation. And looking ahead just a bit, consider what's going to happen to density on the 24 acre Power Plant site as its redeveloped. All these are areas of rapid current and future expansion of density that immediately surround Fire Station 204.

As just one example of the demand for fire engine services in the area, I live in Marina Towers right at the end of Slaters Lane on the Potomac, a 283 unit, 44 year old condo building. In the past year the fire department has had to come to this building about a half dozen times, 2 or 3 times because of fires in units. The rapidly increasing number of such high-density buildings, as well as the age of many current buildings in this area of the City, very much argues against removing the only water-carrying fire truck from Fire Station 204. I urge you not to do it.

My wife and I have lived in Old Town since 1977. Further, my company's townhouse office building is located in Old Town as well.

I have become aware of the issue surrounding Engine House #204 on Prince Street. I believe this firehouse plays an extraordinary role in public safety for one primary reason:

If you were to study a 1-2 mile radius of the Prince Street firehouse, I am quite certain you would notice an vast majority of older homes/buildings that do not have the benefit of current construction standards/ techniques regarding Party Wall fire barriers between one building to another. In other words, the response time required within this radius of the Prince Street firehouse is highly critical in order to avoid multi-building fires taking place within the 1-2 mile radius. I would imagine the Alexandria Board of Architectural Review or the Alexandria Historical Society would have such data regarding the age of buildings in question here at their fingertips.

My supposition: Far too many older houses/ buildings have insufficient party wall construction to prevent one fire moving quickly from one house/ building to another.

I think I could almost copy my email to you from last year- except this year is even worse for older Alexandrians. I see the City Manager (who makes quite a healthy salary), in his proposed budget, made deep cuts to programs that help the most vulnerable in our community. He either doesn't know or doesn't remember what it's like to live on a limited income.

The budget eliminates Senior Taxi, the program helps seniors get to the doctor, pharmacy, or grocery store. Without Senior Taxi, many won't be able to get to the care they need. We can't all afford regular taxi fares. With many outpatient procedure and hospital discharges, people can't go home on the bus (even if a bus gets them close enough to their home). Most Senior Taxi users who could qualify for DOT (the City's paratransit program) already switched to that program.

The budget also slashes the real estate tax relief program for low-income seniors and those with disabilities. Given the high cost of real estate, too many of these people, who are house rich & on limited incomes, may be forced from their homes. Please consider a \$700,000 property value cap. Instead of an exemption, consider a change to a deferral, to be collected when the property is sold by the owner (make it so that if the owner dies & the house is inherited, the taxes are due at that time). This may not help the city's budget now but it will help keep older & disabled Alexandrians in their homes and the City will collect the property taxes in the future.

I'd also like to ask that you maintain the Older Worker Employment Specialist at JobLink. It is difficult for older people to find work on their own. Working people pay taxes, participate in the economy (unless they work at Wal-Mart and other employers who pay the current minimum wage) and need fewer or no financial supports and social services.

One of the most overlooked needs- guardians for elderly individuals who can no longer take care of themselves. Their dire situations put their lives at risk. The city's guardianship program has eight persons on a wait-list. An additional appropriation of \$36,000 would allow them to be served while maintaining those already in the program.

I do not envy your job. I do have a suggestion that will not make you popular, especially with those who have no compassion for citizens of the city they live in, but can afford the very expensive houses being built now. I support the proposed half cent property tax increase. Alexandria has always been a community that cares about its older residents. We have some great programs to help people that are really in need. Please don't let them be decimated.



I am disappointed to see that, once again, Warwick Pool is on the chopping block: I know that these are difficult budgetary times, but I believe it is very important to the long-term health of the city as a community to maintain recreation venues for all its citizens. The pool is an extremely popular, affordable recreation spot that serves one end of the city—not just residents of Warwick Village, for whom the pool house is an essential community resource, but also those in Arlandria (many of whom lack air conditioning in their apartments), who can easily walk to it. This is a population that is unlikely to take advantage of Chinquapin.

I believe it is vital to maintain an aquatic program that is balanced across Alexandria. The city's recent investments in the Warwick Pool site suggest that there is support for a pool or other water feature there; but if the pool closes now, I find it hard to believe that it will ever reopen. Cutting the pool this summer may be penny-wise, but in the long run it would be decision that we all would regret.

Dear Mayor and City Council,

At its April 2, 2014 meeting, staff provided an overview to the Transportation Commission (Commission) of the recommended projects included in the draft FY 2015– FY 2024 transportation budget, highlighting significant funding changes from the FY 2014 – FY 2023 adopted budget and expanded definition of projects that could be funded with Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) funds. The draft budget was developed based on guidance that the Commission provided to staff at its October 2, 2013 meeting regarding the preparation of the budget, as shown below.

- Maintain funding for highest priorities set by the Transportation Commission.
- Allocate Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) 70% funds for high priority major capital investments with regional impacts, with an emphasis on leveraging non-city funds and/or accelerating project delivery.
- Utilize funding sources with the least restrictions on project eligibility (i.e. CMAQ, RSTP, and NVTA 30% funds) for non-motorized projects, project development, ADA improvements, maintenance and operations.
- Commit adequate operating funds to provide the project management, procurement, management and of staff resources necessary to implement new capital projects and programs. Consider capitalizing staff positions that are directly related to capital project implementation, as allowable, in order to utilize capital funds and reduce impacts on the operating budget.
- Ensure that city transportation funding levels are maintained or increased above the maintenance-of-effort requirements of HB2313, to provide new transportation capacity and enhanced transportation services and programs while also maintaining existing assets in a state of good repair.
- Preserve the 2.2 cent transportation reservation in order to comply with maintenance-of-effort requirements, maintain flexibility, and to offset previous loss of state urban funds.

The Commission has had many discussions over the past six months on the FY 2015 – FY 2024 transportation budget. The members of the Commission that were present at the April 3, 2014 meeting support the expanded definition of the TIP and are supportive of the City Manager's draft budget, however, are concerned about the lack of adequate staffing resources to procure and deliver the projects included in the proposed budget.

We appreciate your consideration of the Commission's request to review the proposed FY 2015-FY 2024 CIP.

The Alexandria Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) applauds the City Manager, Alexandria City Council and various Departments for the time and effort utilized in preparation for the budget. While making tough decisions all in the spirit of doing what you believe is in the best interest of the constituents of this City, the NAACP asks that you:

- Provide additional funding for Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS)
- Provide adequate financial resources to ensure maintenance of existing affordable housing as well as fund programs that significantly increase opportunities
- Explain why a reduction in workforce is necessary versus the use of other alternatives (tax increase, furloughs, freeze on merit increases)
- Reconsider the implications of underfunding the public library system and eliminating the law librarian position

Alexandria City Public Schools

The NAACP's is greatly concerned regarding the City Manager's underfunding of the Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS).

While the proposed budget provides additional funding to ACPS, this additional funding will not be enough to adequately fund programming to address the growing achievement gap between minority students and their peers, sufficiently account for the resources needed to meet the needs of the projected increase of student enrollment, and provide adequate resources to some of our most vulnerable populations like ESL learners and students receiving special education services. According to the statistics on page 11.81 of the proposed budget, in SY 12-13 only 35% of special education students passed the reading SOL and 32% passed the math SOL, this is unacceptable! The City has identified four Focus Areas as part of the City Manager's Performance Plan. Two of the outcomes include ensuring the educational and developmental attainment of all residents and ensuring all children and youth thrive, these outcomes cannot be achieved when spending dollars per child is insufficient. Providing ACPS with at least a minimum of 1.5 million dollars will provide teachers and students with the necessary resources to improve educational outcomes and prepare students of varying socioeconomic backgrounds to be successful.

In 2013, Superintendent Morton Sherman hired Victor Martin as the new director of equity to monitor areas of disproportionality within ACPS. Disproportionality exists currently in the enrollment of African-American students in special education, suspension rates in elementary, middle, and high school, as well as K-5 TAG. In addition the achievement gap between African American and Hispanic students and their White and Asian counterparts is vast! Although Dr. Crawley has committed to working aggressively to address this issue, it is unrealistic to think he or the teachers can do so adequately without the necessary resources. It is the NAACP's belief that underfunding ACPS will continue to violate the principal spirit of Brown v. Board of Education wherein you will create an environment of separate and unequal educational opportunities for minority students.

Gwen Lewis and Gwen Day Fuller along with students receiving supportive services through the Concerned Citizen Network of Alexandria spoke at the public hearing held on March 10, 2014. Sitting in the room I was pleasantly surprised to hear the outcomes of the RISE Program being implemented at Hammond Middle School. Our recommendation would be that the City partner with community resources and organizations to implement evidenced based afterschool enrichment programs for students. This type of collaboration promotes positive fiscal responsibility.

Housing

Over the last five years, the City has lost a significant amount of affordable housing and opportunities for home ownership have diminished despite the City's commitment in the 2010 Strategic Plan to promote a continuum of affordable housing opportunities for all residents especially those most in need. The adoption of the Housing Master Plan was a significant step in the right direction however without consistent bold interventions from City Council to fund these goals, gentrification will continue to leave a void in the City. The plan further identifies a goal to create livable communities that enable seniors and persons with disabilities to age or remain in place, we applaud the City Manager's addition of 240,000 for Senior/Disabled rent relief programs but worry about the cuts to the senior tax relief program.

As a result of development, low and moderate income families have been pushed out of a City that they helped grow. When I talk with friends and community members instead of Alexandria being characterized as the diverse, inclusive, affordable City used in print to attract new residents and business, current residents have described Alexandria as "the City of the Haves and the Have Not's". We must do better.

The NAACP believes challenging developers to increase financial contributions beyond the minimum percentages and provide units will assist Council's in reaching the goal of 2,000 units by 2025. The graph on page 12.34 outlines in FY 2014 financial contributions secured through the development process was over two million dollars; however projections for FY 2015 are 850,000. Please explain how this drastic decrease will support additional development opportunities.

Additionally, the NAACP requests the City Council work aggressively with the office of housing and other community partners to ensure fair and equitable housing exists and all efforts to reduce displacement of residents be considered.

Impact of reduction in workforce

Across the proposed budget multiple Departments have chosen a reduction in workforce as a solution. In a city with approximately 300 homeless individuals, 4800 families on food stamps, and 60% of students receiving free and reduced lunch, this decision will ultimately lead to a rise in the number of families visiting the Department of Community and Human Services. The NAACP believes this methodology will negatively impact residents and will add to the frustration of families trying to get ahead. With growing income inequality locally and nationally the NAACP ask that City Council provide information on why this option is more viable versus instituting furlough days, hiring freezes, or freezing merit increases.

In preparation for writing this letter, members of the NAACP executive board interfaced with several employees of Parks and Recreation. The overarching theme was not worry that they themselves could lose their job, but the overall impact on the children and families who participate in the multitude of programming offered at these recreation centers. Growing up in Alexandria, I attended the Cora Kelly Recreation Center and viewed it as a safe place filled with fun and love. When I return to the center, some of those same employees are still there and I marvel at their ability to engage, comfort, and guide the youth of today, in the same manner in which they did for me. The possibility of having senior employees replaced is frightening.

Public Library and Law Library

The proposed Alexandria City budget is a cruel letdown for school children, parents, and patrons of our public and law libraries. African Americans once had to go to separate but unequal schools and were not permitted to enter the City's Jim Crow public library. Samuel Tucker and other brave heroes held a sit-in there in August 1939 against a hateful racial divide. But more than 70 years later, our poor people of all races must still put up with a reading divide just as unfair.

In the City Amazon calls the "most well read" in the United States based on the company's sales statistics, we've got two classes of readers—affluent Amazon customers and the rest of us, not so equal. Even without a proposed cut, our local public library can spend only \$3.25 per capita on books and other materials annually. \$3.25 is far below the national average of \$4.22 in the 2010 fiscal year. This in a city of Volvos, BMWs and an ever-growing number of multimillion-dollar homes! And now our City manager's office wants a \$25,000 net cut in money for books—just a mere fragment of a proposed operating budget of \$635 million. What shameful priorities. As we approach National Library Week--April 13-19—surely Alexandria can do better.

Adding to the disgrace, we are about to lay off a dedicated law librarian—who works daily to help moderate to low income patrons navigate local laws and enjoy fairer treatment under our legal system. If these aren't civil rights issues, pray tell just what is? Martin Luther King once said that "The function of education is to teach one to think intensively and to think critically". How can education and full citizenship happen without enough money for schools, teachers, books and librarians? We have genuine civil rights in the voting booths in Alexandria. Why can't we have them in our classrooms and libraries?

That means well-stocked, well-staffed public and school libraries. Alexandrians deserve enough money for public library programs to encourage everyone even in the poorest families to read

for fun as well as for school and work. We can't just think of our children while neglecting their parents—their role models—and the budget must reflect this.

Our library system needs the resources to continue the transition to e-books. This means not just a better selection of titles but also well-promoted training for users of all ages and the purchase and lending of suitable devices (perhaps with ownership as an eventual option for the low-income readers who participate the most actively in library programs). Used Kindles sell for as little as \$45 on Craigslist. Imagine the benefits not just for young families but also elderly people unable to drive or even ride to the library. E-book devices are easier for frail, arthritic hands to hold than are heavy large-print books.

Alexandria must keep Christine Hall, the law librarian, if it is to maintain its reputation as a City respectful of civil rights. She is a true beacon to those in need of legal advice, as a law librarian for 7 1/2 years. Ms. Hall's professional and educational skills make her essential to the fabric of the Alexandria community. The information she leads patrons to is not available locally for free on the Net or at the public library—only through the law library's print collection and electronic databases.

Ms. Hall's office received 6,600 reference requests last year. Sixty-five percent of patrons are not attorneys. Without legal remedies easily available, how can we expect individuals to educate and empower themselves.

If a tax increase is not possible to help pay for the above, then we recommend a good, hard-look at personnel costs of all kinds, from the top on down—especially in areas such as “merit pay” for upper-level administrators.

The NAACP recognizes the significant challenges city departments and City Council face approaching the FY2015 budget. The cuts to various departments and community services appear to be an assault on the civil rights of children, the poor, and the most vulnerable in the Alexandria workforce.
