ORAL REPORTS FROM CITY COUNCIL ON BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES.

* WMATA (Mayor Euille)

Mayor Euille reported that WMATA (Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority) introduced the new 7000 series car for the train system. Mayor Euille stated that upgrading the cars demonstrated WMATA's commitment to improving the quality of the service offered to the customers and he noted that the cars were safer, stronger and technologically advanced. Mayor Euille also stated that the WMATA Board is committing to half a billion dollars over the next several years in order to upgrade all the cars in the system.

* Potomac Yard Metro Implementation Group (Councilman Wilson and Mayor Euille)

Councilman Wilson gave in update on the activities surrounding the planning for the Potomac Yard Metro Station. Councilman Wilson stated that on April 3, the Environmental Protection Agency published a notice for public comment on the Environmental Impact Study (EIS) and the period for public comment lasts until May 18. Councilman Wilson stated that there have been three open houses to discuss the plan and there will be a formal public hearing on May 16. Councilman Wilson noted that WMATA will hold a series of meetings, including a public hearing on April 30. Councilman Wilson noted that on April 20 May 20, City Council will have a special meeting to approve the locally preferred option.

* COG Climate, Energy and Environmental Policy Committee (Councilwoman Pepper)

Councilwoman Pepper reported that the Climate, Energy and Environmental Policy Committee have been having ongoing discussions about solar energy and Montgomery County has a contract for solar energy that is less in cost than their electricity contract. Councilwoman Pepper stated that Montgomery County invited the City to join their contract but because of different rules and regulations in Virginia, the contract would not be beneficial to the City. Councilwoman Pepper also reported that COG is developing a draft list of strategies to aid in the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions for state and local governments to meet regional and local reduction goals. Councilwoman Pepper suggested that some of these strategies might be incorporated into the City's Environmental Action Plan.
