My name is Brian Cousins. Nancy was my next door neighbor for many years. Once a month my large family had a gathering known as birthday Sunday. There are 15 kids in our family, the 2 parents and dozens of grandchildren. Needless to say our Sunday afternoon gatherings could be raucous occasions.

These parties, I suspected, over the years encouraged folks to leave the house next door. The Dunnings were different. Nancy is from a big family herself. And our large gatherings never upset the Dunnings. In fact it amused them.

When I was in high school I befriended Nancy's daughter Liz and drove her to school when we both attended T.C. Williams. I attended Liz's wedding and we are still in touch to this day.

When my Father died, Nancy brought over a few home cooked casseroles for my grieving family to eat. It was gesture of kindness and grace that I will never forget. At my Father's funeral Jim dropped holy communion right in of me and had to bend down quickly and pick it up to complete the sacrament. His momentary clumsiness gave me a laugh that I desperately needed and haven't forgotten.

I miss these two people terribly. They were wonderful neighbors and generous and thoughtful company.

I am still shaken by how Nancy died and how her passing left Jim and their children and extended family. The suffering is still impossible to measure. 
