### HOW DO WE DEFINE "ECE" IN TERMS OF THE AGES AND TYPES OF SERVICES IT ENTAILS?

"Prenatal is definitely part of a holistic ECE system, but we need to be very targeted in how we engage in the pre-natal to three space."








## THE ECEW HAS HAD A NUMBER OF SUCCESSES TO DATE:



"The Allegheny field trip helped us envision what was really possible."



"When we put together the brochure, I was really impressed; I didn't think we could be at that stage so quickly."



The Quality Collaborative formed around CLASS Professional Development for VPI, Head Start, and Early Childhood Special Education teachers. Cohort includes 60+ lead teachers in 41 early childhood classrooms, serving more than 720 of the City's highest need young children. Additional partnership with UVa for evaluation of 3 year pilot.



### WHAT WOULD SUCCESS IN 3 YEARS LOOK LIKE IN TERMS OF PROCESSES IN PLACE?

- Strategic direction: We are all aligned on a goal and what strategies we'll employ to achieve that goal
- 2. Clear implementation plan: We understand our 'next steps' clearly, gathering inputs (e.g., data) with a specific purpose in mind
- 3. Effective, output-oriented meeting facilitation: We have task forces with specific marching orders that tie back directly to our strategies
- 4. Dedicated individual to shepherd the work forward: We need a champion who wakes up every day with pre-natal to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade ECE on their mind

### Indicators:



### A SHARED MEASUREMENT SYSTEM IS A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF THIS WORK

### **Definition**

Identifying common metrics for tracking progress across organizations and systems toward a common agenda

### **Benefits**

- Tracking progress toward a shared goal
- Enabling coordination and collaboration
- Improved data quality
- Continuous learning and course correction
- Catalyzing action

### **Shared Measurement is not:**

- Meant to measure the impact of a single organization or intervention
- × Simple data collection or "just an IT platform"
- x Focused only (or mostly) on programmatic measures
- × Meant to be punitive
- × Meant to foster competition
- × A once-a-year report
- × A retrospective evaluation

## THE CREATION OF A SHARED MEASUREMENT SYSTEM ENTAILS THREE STEPS

Design

Develop

**Deploy** 

- Shared vision for the system and its relation to the broader goals and theory of change for the effort
- View of current state of knowledge and data
- Governance and organization for structured participation
- Identification of metrics and data collection approaches
- Working through issues of confidentiality/privacy/ transparency

- Development of webbased platform and data collection tools
- Refinement and testing of platform and tools to ensure both processes and data are clean
- Staffing for data
  management and synthesis
  (i.e. in order for data to be
  effective, resources are
  needed for inputting,
  analyzing and reporting
  back out)

- Learning forums and continuous improvement to allow all participants to benefit from the data
- **Communication** of results (e.g. through dashboards)
- Ongoing infrastructure support (e.g., building out new capabilities)
- Improve system based on a pilot, review, refinement, and ongoing evaluation of usability and impact
