ISSUE: Partial Demolition and Alterations

APPLICANT: Tyler and Ruby Schropp

LOCATION: 609 South Fairfax Street

ZONE: RM / Residential

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the application with the following archaeology conditions:

- 1. The archaeology conditions below shall appear on all site plans and construction drawings that involve demolition or ground disturbance (including Basement/Foundation Plans, Demolition, Erosion and Sediment Control, Grading, Landscaping, Utilities, and Sheeting and Shoring) so that on-site contractors are aware of the requirements.
 - a. The applicant/developer shall call Alexandria Archaeology immediately (703-838-4399) if any buried structural remains (wall foundations, wells, privies, cisterns, etc.) or concentrations of artifacts are discovered during development. Work must cease in the area of the discovery until a City archaeologist comes to the site and records the finds.
 - b. The applicant/developer shall not allow any metal detection or artifact collection to be conducted on the property, unless authorized by Alexandria Archaeology.

GENERAL NOTES TO THE APPLICANT

- 1. ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF APPROPRIATENESS AND PERMITS TO DEMOLISH: Applicants must obtain a stamped copy of the Certificate of Appropriateness or Permit to Demolish PRIOR to applying for a building permit. Contact BAR Staff, Room 2100, City Hall, 703-746-3833, or preservation@alexandriava.gov for further information.
- 2. APPEAL OF DECISION: In accordance with the Zoning Ordinance, if the Board of Architectural Review denies or approves an application in whole or in part, the applicant or opponent may appeal the Board's decision to City Council on or before 14 days after the decision of the Board.
- 3. COMPLIANCE WITH BAR POLICIES: All materials must comply with the BAR's adopted policies unless otherwise specifically approved.
- 4. BUILDING PERMITS: Most projects approved by the Board of Architectural Review require the issuance of one or more construction permits by Building and Fire Code Administration (<u>including signs</u>). The applicant is responsible for obtaining all necessary construction permits after receiving Board of Architectural Review approval. Contact Code Administration, Room 4200, City Hall, 703-838-4360 for further information.
- 5. EXPIRATION OF APPROVALS NOTE: In accordance with Sections 10-106(B) and 10-206(B) of the Zoning Ordinance, any official Board of Architectural Review approval will expire 12 months from the date of issuance if the work is not commenced and diligently and substantially pursued by the end of that 12-month period.
- 6. HISTORIC PROPERTY TAX CREDITS: Applicants performing extensive, certified rehabilitations of historic properties may separately be eligible for state and/or federal tax credits. Consult with the <u>Virginia Department of Historic Resources (VDHR)</u> prior to initiating any work to determine whether the proposed project may qualify for such credits.

Note:

Staff coupled the reports for BAR #2015-0197 (Permit to Demolish) and BAR #2015-0198 (Certificate of Appropriateness) for clarity and brevity. This item requires a roll call vote.

I. ISSUE

The applicant is proposing to rework the existing open porch at the rear of the building and to expand the third floor balcony. An existing balcony and pergola will be removed above the second story and it will be replaced with a new balcony atop the existing porch. The porch will be screened with fixed louvered painted wood shutters at the second story, replacing standard lattice.

The rear porch is obliquely visible from South Fairfax Street and partially visible through rear yards from Gibbon Street in the winter months.

II. <u>HISTORY</u>

Historic maps indicate that there was a structure on this property at least by the late 19th century and Ethelyn Cox in *Historic Alexandria, Virginia Street by Street*, states that the standing structure dates to possibly to the **early 19th century**, a clapboard building with stuccoed ends, two stories, at the time Ms. Cox completed the research. Although historic maps indicate that there was a building with a similar footprint dating to pre-1877, the existing windows, foundation, dormer and siding are all later materials. John Rust was hired for an extensive renovation of the property in the 1970s. Additional research into whether there is any existing historic framing or roof rafters would be necessary in order to determine if this house was entirely rebuilt. The rear addition, and rear porch that is the subject of the request, was approved by the BAR in **1977** (5/18/1977).

III. ANALYSIS

The project is in compliance with zoning ordinance requirements.

In considering a Permit to Demolish, the Board must consider the following criteria set forth in the Zoning Ordinance, §10-105(B):

- (1) Is the building or structure of such architectural or historical interest that its moving, removing, capsulating or razing would be to the detriment of the public interest?
- (2) Is the building or structure of such interest that it could be made into a historic house?
- (3) Is the building or structure of such old and unusual or uncommon design, texture and material that it could not be reproduced or be reproduced only with great difficulty?
- (4) Would retention of the building or structure help preserve the memorial character of the George Washington Memorial Parkway?
- (5) Would retention of the building or structure help preserve and protect an historic place or area of historic interest in the city?
- (6) Would retention of the building or structure promote the general welfare by maintaining and increasing real estate values, generating business, creating new positions, attracting tourists, students, writers, historians, artists and artisans, attracting new residents, encouraging study and interest in American history, stimulating interest and study in architecture and design,

educating citizens in American culture and heritage, and making the city a more attractive and desirable place in which to live?

None of the above criteria are met, in the opinion of staff. The area proposed for partial demolition is limited to a 1977 rear balcony above the second story. The lattice being removed would not be considered appropriate and may not have been approved by the BAR. Therefore, staff has no objection to the proposed partial demolition.

The *Design Guidelines* note that "porches should be appropriate to the historical style of the structure" and "should be made of materials which are sympathetic to the building materials found in the historic districts." Staff finds the proposed redesign of the porch to be appropriate and consistent with the *Guidelines*. The scale and design of the porch is appropriate to the rear addition and the use of painted wood louvered shutters and trim are compatible with materials found throughout the district.

Staff strongly supports the redesign of this porch finding it an improvement over the existing conditions. Staff conditions approval with Archaeology's requested conditions.

Zoning Comments

C-1 Proposed alterations to existing porch and 3rd floor balcony comply with zoning.

Code Administration

- <u>For a Private Alley</u> The applicant must provide proof, in the form of an affidavit at a minimum, from owner of the alley granting permission of use. (T&ES)
- C-1 The applicant shall comply with the City of Alexandria's Solid Waste Control, Title 5, Chapter 1, which sets forth the requirements for the recycling of materials (Sec. 5-1-99). (T&ES)
- C-2 The applicant shall comply with the City of Alexandria's Noise Control Code, Title 11, Chapter 5, which sets the maximum permissible noise level as measured at the property line. (T&ES)
- C-3 Roof, surface and sub-surface drains be connected to the public storm sewer system, if available, by continuous underground pipe. Alexandria Archaeology

Finding

1. Although the proposed project likely will have little or no impact on the ground surface, historic maps indicate that there was a structure on this property at least by the late 19th century and Ethelyn Cox in *Historic Alexandria, Virginia Street by Street*, states that the standing structure dates to probably to the early 19th century, a clapboard building with stuccoed ends, two stories (1976:51). The property therefore has the potential to yield archaeological resources which could provide insight into domestic activities in 19th-century Alexandria.

Recommendations

- *1. The applicant/developer shall call Alexandria Archaeology immediately (703-838-4399) if any buried structural remains (wall foundations, wells, privies, cisterns, etc.) or concentrations of artifacts are discovered during development. Work must cease in the area of the discovery until a City archaeologist comes to the site and records the finds.
- *2. The applicant/developer shall not allow any metal detection or artifact collection to be conducted on the property, unless authorized by Alexandria Archaeology.

3. The statements in archaeology conditions above marked with an asterisk "*" shall appear in the General Notes of all site plans and on all site plan sheets that involve demolition or ground disturbance (including Basement/Foundation Plans, Demolition, Erosion and Sediment Control, Grading, Landscaping, Utilities, and Sheeting and Shoring) so that onsite contractors are aware of the requirements.


