Virginia Department of Transportation Grant	Virginia Department of Transportation	These funds are from a federal grant to be used to mill and repave the Route 236 (Duke Street) from Quaker Lane to South Jordan Street, Rte 401 (North Van Dorn Street) from Seminary Road to Menokin Drive, and Route 401 (N. Van Dorn Street) from S. Pickett Street to Edsall Road. The funding previously needed for these streets will be applied towards other streets on the repaving list, to be completed by the end of the fiscal year. 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Federal Transit Administration	FTA	The project will provide Transit Signal Priority (TSP) improvements to support a future rapid bus service from Van Dorn Metrorail Station to the Pentagon as part of a \$670,000 Federal TIGER Grant. The grant is a regionally coordinated effort with the Transportation Planning Board overseeing the jurisdictions' application and funding. The budget for the TSP component has increased from \$395,350 to \$517,046, of which \$79,481 has been transferred from Alexandria's Next Bus/Super Stop component to cover part of the increase. The difference, \$42,215, is transferred through this supplemental appropriation from the District of Columbia Department of Transportation 14th Street Bridge project from within the same TIGER grant approval.
