Dear Mr. McPherson,

Thank you for taking the time to send us your comments regarding the proposed traffic signal at North Van Dorn and Menokin Drive.

The signal is proposed as part of a pedestrian safety project which will make changes to the intersection. It is because of these changes that the signal is needed and with the new design the signal will actually function to improve the traffic flow. The new configuration of the intersection will remove the right slip lane onto North Van Dorn Street and add crosswalks, sidewalks and pedestrian countdown signals. The removal of the right slip lane is key to the need for the signal. The signal will provide a green arrow for these right turning vehicles in order to ensure they do not back up. Without a signal, a stop sign would be required, and our traffic analysis shows that the stop sign would create delays and queues that could extend to King Street. The graphic on page 28 of the Traffic and Parking Board Docket provides an illustration of the queues at the intersection with and without the signal.

A letter of support was attached from the church, but one was from the preschool, which functions five days a week, not only on Sunday. Staff had received a number of requests from parents of children attending the preschool requesting improvement for pedestrian safety at this intersection. The proposed traffic signal will actually function to help traffic the most during the AM and PM rush hours on the weekdays. For more information on the project, visit the <u>project website</u>.


