What is Vision Zero?



Vision Zero is a multi-national traffic safety project that aims to achieve a transportation system with zero deaths or serious injuries.

- Multidisciplinary approach to rethinking traffic safety
- Recognize traffic deaths and serious injuries are preventable
- Sets aggressive timeline to eliminate both
- Strategic and measurable goals
- Data-driven

What has the process been?







- → May 2016 Adopted Pedestrian & Bicycle Master Plan
- → January 2017 Adopted Vision Zero Policy
- → February 2017 Interdepartmental Work Group formed

(T&ES, APD, OPA, and others)

- → Spring/summer 2017 Data analysis
- → May 2017 Extensive public outreach (led by T&ES)
- → Summer 2017 Action Plan Development (led by T&ES)



How did we engage the public?








Purpose: Increase awareness of the Vision Zero concept and gain insight into the public's safety issue areas, biggest concerns, and priorities for transportation safety



Street Meetings: 6 locations and 467 people engaged

Online Survey: 560 participants

Online Wikimap: 676 Comments

What did the public say?





Top 3 Challenges to Safely Moving Around Alexandria

- 1. Districted drivers
- 2. Speeding
- 3. People running red lights and stop signs



Over 16% of participants had experienced or knew someone that was seriously injured or died in a crash. Primary factors reported were (in order):


- 1. Districted drivers

Where are we?




The City Had 22 Killed or Seriously Injured (KSI) crashes in 2016, down from 55 in 2011.


Pedestrian, Bike, and Vehicle KSI risk all

Old town has the highest concentration of crashes

KSI crashes are concentrated along certain corridors:

- Duke Street
- Washington Street
- West Glebe Rd

- N. Beauregard St.
- Seminary
- Route 1










Pedestrians and bicyclists only represent 6% of all crashes...



But they represent 34% of all KSI crashes.

Citywide Effort: APD Traffic Safety Plan Goals

- Strategic Traffic Safety Plan through Education & Enforcement
- Ensuring safe travel throughout the City for people driving, biking and walking
- Eradicating traffic crashes, serious injuries and fatalities
- Creating a safe, viable and balanced system
- Promoting voluntary compliance with traffic laws
- Improve data collection & analysis to predict/respond to issues







Citywide Effort: APD Traffic Safety Plan Strategies

- Coordinated strategies with Vision Zero Action
 Plan
 - Work with T&ES to address engineering of streets, crosswalks and bicycle paths
 - Recommend traffic safety legislative changes
- Department-wide involvement
- Creation of the Traffic Safety Section
- Encourage and promote proactive communication
- Focus on Traffic Problem Issues
