SUBJECT: ADDITIONAL PUBLIC HEARING

Since 1963, the City Code has specified that the City Council shall hold 10 public hearing meetings per year, in each month other than July and August¹. In 2018, Alexandria is now the only jurisdiction in Northern Virginia to take a two-month recess².

While the extended recess is certainly valuable to both policymakers and staff, the impact of this recess is to prevent any action on land-use matters from occurring for a three-month period. This impacts commercial activity, particularly that of small businesses, throughout our City.

Council has worked in recent years to transition additional uses to administrative approvals. While these efforts can reduce the caseload, our September docket is evidence of the significant quantity of minor changes that continue to require full hearings before the Planning Commission and City Council. Forcing applicants to wait from June until September is out of sync with the region and unfair.

As we prepare our 2019 schedule, we would request that the City Manager propose appropriate timing for an additional public hearing for both the Planning Commission and City Council in the summer of 2019. In conjunction with this change, we request that the City Manager bring forward revisions to City Code to accommodate this schedule revision.
