1 ORDINANCE NO. 2 3 AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Article F (PERMIT PARKING DISTRICTS) of 4 Chapter 8 (PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS) of Title 5 (TRANSPORTATION 5 AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES) of the Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 6 1981, as amended, by amending Section 5-8-84 (PAY BY PHONE PARKING FEE 7 WITHIN A RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING DISTRICT). 8 9 THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS: 10 11 Section 1. That Title 5, Chapter 8, Article F, Section 5-8-84 of the Code of the City 12 of Alexandria, Virginia, 1981, as amended, be, and the same hereby is, amended by deleting the 13 language shown in strikethrough and adding the language shown as underlined as follows: 14 15 Sec. 5-8-84 –Pay By Phone Parking Fee within a Residential Permit Parking District. 16 17 (a) Purpose: On residential blocks adjacent to metered areas, which are often occupied by vehicles belonging to non-residents of the district, a pay by phone parking fee may be 18 19 implemented that requires non-residents of the district to pay to park on the block during the 20 posted times. The provisions of this Section shall expire on March 1, 2019. 21 22 (b) Parking restrictions: Residential blocks with a pay by phone parking fee shall prohibit 23 parking in designated areas by motor vehicles which do not display a valid parking permit for 24 that district or have not submitted appropriate payment through either the pay by phone 25 application referenced on the posted signage or a City parking meter. 26 27 (1) The hourly parking fee shall be consistent with the cost of a meter as established in 28 Section 5-8-93. 29 30 (2) The hours during which a parking fee is applicable shall be consistent with the existing posted hours of restriction. Changes to the posted hours shall be reviewed by the 31 32 traffic and parking board pursuant to section 5-8-72(b). 33 34 (c) Establishment: A pay by phone parking fee may be added to certain designated residential 35 permit parking district blocks in accordance with the following criteria and procedures: 36 37 (1) The area subject to parking fee must be on a block with existing metered spaces, 38 adjacent to an existing metered block, or adjacent to a block where a residential pay by 39 phone parking fee has also been approved. For the purposes of this subsection (1), an area that consists of multiple adjacent blocks may be considered simultaneously, so 40 41 long as one block meets this locational requirement, and provided that all other 42 requirements of this Section are met for each individual block. 43 44 (2) The block must be located within the Special Parking District Area.

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1 2	(3) The area subject to parking fee must already be posted with residential parking restrictions.
3	(4) The request to odd a new by phone populing fee must be initiated by the residents of the
4 5	(4) The request to add a pay by phone parking fee must be initiated by the residents of the block through a petition signed by an occupant of more than 50 percent of the residents
6 7	of residential properties abutting the block and submitted to the city manager.
8	(5) Upon receipt of a petition for a block meeting the criteria established above, the city
9	manager shall direct staff to conduct a survey of the parking conditions on the block. The
10	survey shall be taken during the hours of the existing residential parking restrictions. If
11	staff observes that 75% or more of the available parking spaces on the block are
12	occupied, the city manager shall forward the request to the traffic and parking board for
13	its review and recommendation at a public hearing.
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15	(6) If less than 75% of the available spaces are occupied, additional surveys may be made at other times of the day. If the surveys do not so demonstrate, the petition shall be
16 17	deemed denied and no further action will be taken.
18	deemed demed and no further action will be taken.
19	(7) Following the board's recommendation, the manager shall decide the petition and
20	cause his decision to be implemented; provided that in the event the manager decides not
21	to adopt the recommendation of the board or, whether or not in accord with the
22	recommendation of the board, decides to deny the petition, he shall forward the petition,
23	along with the board's recommendation and the reasons for his decision to city council
24	which shall make the final decision on the petition.
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26 27	(8) Parking restrictions may be removed from a block face in accordance with
28	<u>Section 5-8-77(a).</u>
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30	Section 2. That Title 5, Chapter 8, Article F, Section 5-8-84, as amended pursuant to
31	Section 1 of this ordinance, be, and the same hereby is, reordained as part of the Code of the City
32	of Alexandria.
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34	Section 3. That this ordinance shall become effective upon the date and at the time
35	of its final passage.
