- The Alexandria Transit Company (ATC) Board will make final recommendations





Project Goals and Objectives


- Identify community transit priorities and values
- Design future bus network based on community transit priorities and current / future demand
 - Unbiased (start with blank slate)
 - Comprehensive / Inclusive
 - Data-Driven (Demographic, O/D pairs, etc.)
 - Reflective of Community / stakeholder values
 - Unconstrained
- Address emerging transportation technologies

Maximum Ridership


Some Service for Everyone

Where on the spectrum should Alexandria's transit network be?


Public Input – Frequency (Ridership) vs. Coverage






Existing Midday Network






Coverage Concept






Residents near Transit on Weekdays at Noon


within 1/4 mile of a bus stop in Alexandria, Virginia

How far can I travel...


...in 30 minutes from W. Glebe Rd and Old Dominion Blvd?






Coverage Service Concept

60% more residents and 189% more jobs accessible than existing network





Columbus, OH


Significant increase in ridership since 2017 implementation

Richmond, VA


Increase in ridership in first 6 months since implementation
