# KEY POLICY PRIORITIES AND ACTIONS

- Housing Contributions Workgroup—Secure the highest possible level of developer contributions for new assisted living and memory care facilities
- Mixed-Income Affordable Assisted Living—Identify a suitable site and owner/operator for a non-profit, mixed-income, affordable assisted living facility in the City
- Service-Enriched Housing for Older Adults—Ensure that both new and existing independent living units for older residents include the option of services provided on-site that allow residents to remain in their homes for as long as possible
- Rent Relief—Study the City's Rent Relief Program and make recommendations for changes or enhancements

# KEY POLICY PRIORITIES AND ACTIONS

- Support for DASH—Ensure that locations with older resident populations have DASH service that meets their needs
- Council Engagement in Dementia Friendly Alexandria—Support an expanded reach of Dementia Friendly Alexandria through Council engagement
- Full-Time Older Worker Employment Specialist— Include in City budget full-time specialist to overcome obstacles older job applicants face
