KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Recovery Bag Program with APD and DCHS
- Expansion of Narcan distribution, including to all sworn APD officers and in the IAH ED
- Rapid access to DCHS Opioid Treatment Program
- Alexandria Treatment Court
- Educated restaurant workers on overdoses and physicians on prescribing guidelines
- Creation of Opioid website and educational materials
- Community forums focused on both education and open discussion
- Substance use prevention seminars in ACPS
- Expansion of Drug Take Back opportunities, including take back days and permanent drop off boxes
- Lock and Talk Efforts

SELECTED ACTIONS

Goal 1: Utilize prevention and education efforts to reduce opioid use and its harmful effects throughout the city of Alexandria

- Provide education and develop relationships with the prescribing and providing community
- Plan and promote drug take back events and ongoing efforts
- Provide education and support to the community around opioid use and abuse

Goal 2: Provide evidence based and effective treatment services in order to promote long term opioid use recovery

- Increase availability of Medication Assisted Treatment throughout the community
- Increase Peer Work related to opioid treatment and support
- Increase involvement of the recovery and using community

Goal 3: Create an overall opioid supply reduction plan across the City of Alexandria

- Engage the local prescribing community
- Ensure real time tracking and monitoring of local and national opioid trends
- Continued focused law enforcement work on opioid supply reduction

Goal 4: Provide a diversion path from the criminal justice system into treatment for those who qualify and who would greatly benefit from recovery support

Expand Alexandria Treatment Court

Goal 5: Respond immediately, effectively and collaboratively to all opioid overdoses

- Maintain the Recovery Bag program
- Continue to assess and develop effective strategies for data collection and monitoring
