Previous Boards and Commissions Review



- 1975 Report of the Ad Hoc Budget Advisory Committee recommended a review of the City's committee structure to achieve a more efficient committee system.
- December 1977 Resolution 586 made recommendations to:
 - Consolidate existing committees
 - Create procedures for eliminating and creating committees
 - City Staff for support of committees
 - Eliminate committees with completed missions

Boards and Commissions Review (cont.)



- Committee on Committees was established in 1978 and a report was issued in the fall.
- 11 committees were dissolved at that time including: Building Code Advisory Board, Commission on Criminal Justice, Budget Procedures Committee, and Bicycle Lanes and Bicycle Storage Facilities (Resolution 689)

2008 – Report from the Council Committee on Boards and Commissions



 Committee reviewed general requirements for appointments, term limits, efficiencies that could be made by combining groups and sunsetting groups, and review residency waiver policy.

Goals/Expectations



Reviewing the process, procedures and policies as they relate to the advisory bodies and to return to City Council with recommendations on any modifications and/or changes to boards and commissions.

Recommendations/Updates



Update to Boards/Commissions Database and Website

- New database system has been implemented to collect application and demographics.
- Appointment Notifications/Onboarding of New Members
 - City Clerk's Office sends out notification letters and a member handbook has been created.
- Applications for appointment
 - All fields of the application, except the voluntary demographic portion, be mandatory



Term Limits

- Removal of the provision allowing waiver of the term limit.
- Once ten-year term is reached, member must wait a calendar year before reapplying.
- Residency Waiver
 - No change recommended. Better enforcement of current rules.
- Annual Reports
 - Add enforcement mechanism for late and missing reports.



Meeting Places

- No change on this matter recommended at this time.

Oath of Office

 Enforcement provision stating that an oath not returned with 60 days of appointment could result in removal from the committee.



Bylaws

- Bylaws become a mandatory requirement with enumerated areas to promote consistency.
- Create a new City Code provision requiring creation of bylaws consistent with the City Code, State and Federal law.
- To be filed with the City Clerk's Office and reviewed by committee annually.

Policy Recommendations



- Social Media and Communications Policy
 - Establish a social media/communication policy similar to the procedures for City departments.
- Fundraising Policy
 - General Rule: Solicitation and Collection of funds by committees is prohibited.
 - City Council may establish appropriate exceptions, grandfathering groups currently fundraising, or other components of this prohibition. A fundraising policy would be created by the City Manager's Office and Finance Department for any groups allowed to engage in fundraising



Composition of Boards/Commissions and Review of Boards/Commissions

- No list of specific boards for consolidation, restructuring, and abolition.
- Need further guidance from Council, as a whole, about committees to be changed or dissolved (if any).
