In my professional life, I currently serve on the Diversity and Inclusion Working Group for my bureau. It is in the space of diversity and inclusion where my interest in this commission begins. While not diagnosed with HIV/AIDS, I am nonetheless diagnosed with an illness that often carries a stigma and for a long time this stigma served as a barrier which limited access to health care and support for my long term care. My interest in ensuring public policy is brought forward to educate members of our community and to mitigate the effects of stigma and ignorance comes from a deeply personal space which provides appropriate context for service to those in need in our community.
