10	Section 1. That Title 12, Chapter 10 of the Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia,
11	1981, as amended, be, and the same hereby is, amended by deleting the text shown in
12	strikethrough and adding the text shown in underline as follows:

14	CHAPTER 10
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16	The Children, Youth and Families Collaborative Commission
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18	Sec. 12-10-1 Creation of commission.
19	There is hereby established a commission to be known as The Children, Youth
20	and Families Collaborative Commission (hereinafter referred to in this chapter as the
21 22	commission). (Ord. No. 4727, 6/25/11, Sec. 2)
23	Sec. 12-10-2 Composition; appointment; terms; chairperson and officers; committees.
24	(a) The commission shall consist of 29 members, 25 of whom shall be voting
25	members and four non-voting members. Seventeen of the voting members shall be
26	citizens, four shall be city staff members, and four shall be staff members from the
27	Alexandria City Public Schools. Two of the non-voting members shall be liaisons from
28	the city council, and two shall be liaisons from the Alexandria School Board.
29	(1) Citizen members.
30	a. Eight of the seventeen members shall be approved by city council
31	and shall be city residents. They shall consist of: six community members
32	with expertise in children, youth and family issues, public safety,
33	medical/health related profession or non-profit experience and two young
34	adults, age 18— <u>2125</u> .
35	b. Six of the seventeen members shall be approved by the Alexandria
36	School Board and shall be city residents. They shall consist of community
37	members with experiences as parents, guardians, teachers and/or expertise
38	in early childhood, youth or general education policy.
39 40	c. Three of the seventeen members shall be approved by the youth
40	council and shall be high school students.
41 42	d. The terms of the citizen members shall be three years and shall be
42 43	staggered, except the terms of the citizen members who are high school
43	students shall be one year.

1	(2) City staff Four of the 20 members shall be sity staff identified by the sity			
1	(2) City staff. Four of the 29 members shall be city staff identified by the city			
2 3	manager. The terms of the City staff shall be three years and shall be staggered.			
4	(3) Alexandria City Public School members. Four of the 29 members shall be identified by the superintendent. The terms of the ACPS members shall be three			
4 5	identified by the superintendent. The terms of the ACPS members shall be three years and shall be staggered.			
6	(4) Ex-officio members. Two of the four non-voting members shall be			
7	liaisons from the city council. Two of the four non-voting members shall be			
8	liaisons from the school board. The terms of the ex-officio members shall be three			
8 9	years and shall be staggered.

10	(b) The commission shall elect from among its voting members a chairman and such alternating between aity and school representatives each term and such			
12	chairman-elect, alternating between city and school representatives each term and such			
12	other officers as it deems necessary. The chairman-elect is intended to succeed the			
13 14	chairman for the following term, supported by the past year's chairman, and a new chairman-elect. These three officers shall determine the commission committees'			
14	membership and leadership. The terms of the chairman and chairman-elect shall be for			
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10	(c) The commission shall have seven committees, that mirror the Children and Youth			
17	Master Plan structure, comprised of commission members who serve as leaders and			
18 19	officers of each group and members of the community at large with a demonstrated			
20	interest in issues involving children, youth and families.			
20 21	(1) Executive committee. The executive committee shall consist of the elected			
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22	commission officers, and the may include leaders of each commission committee.			
23 24	The executive committee shall be led by the commission chairman and chairman- elect. The functions and duties of the executive committee shall be as follows:

23 26	a. oversee and coordinate organizational activities;b. set the commission meeting agenda;			
20 27	c. make decisions consistent with those adopted by the commission;			
28	d. oversee implementation of the city council's work plan as			
28 29	developed by the commission;			
30	e. conduct periodic reviews of the purpose and membership of the			
31	other commission committees and make recommendations to the			
32	commission for any changes; and			
33	f. address any issues requiring immediate attention of the			
33 34	commission.			
35	(2) Advocacy and policy committee. The functions and duties of the advocacy			
36	and policy committee shall be as follows:			
30 37	a. review legislative issues, recommend policy and operational or			
38	procedural changes as appropriate;			
39	b. responsible for preparing briefing materials and position			
40	statements for distribution throughout the community; and			
41	c. prepare the annual report to city council and the school board			
42	based on commission activities and meeting minutes.

1	(3) Finance and grants committee. The functions and duties of the finance and
2	grants committee shall be as follows:
3	a. review city and school budgets and provide recommendations
4	during the budget cycle as appropriate;
5	b. develop grant guidelines, identify potential efficiencies in funding
6	practices between the schools and the city regarding youth issues, and
7	determine financial impact of suggested youth program changes; and
8	c. audit grant reports to determine cost benefit and measure
9	effectiveness, recommending metric adjustments as appropriate.
10	(4) Outreach and membership committee. The functions and duties of the
11	outreach and membership committee shall be as follows:
12	a. train commission members annually;
13	b. recruit new members;
14	c. identify potential new community partners for children, youth and
15	family programs and assist with developing a memorandum of
16	understanding as appropriate;
17	d. provide periodic briefings and presentations throughout the
18	community on commission activities;
19	e. review applications for committee memberships; and
20	f. make recommendations to city council and the school board on
21	appointments to the commission.
22	(5) Research and data committee. The functions and duties of the research and
23	data committee shall be as follows:
24	a. collect and distribute outcome data on initiatives in a youth master
25	plan;
26	b. review research literature on successful youth studies and monitor
27	efforts by youth commissions, partnerships and collaborations throughout
28	the nation and youth programs in the City of Alexandria;
29	c. participate in regional, state and national forums and meetings as
30	appropriate; and
31	d. recommend procedures and processes for the sharing of data across
32	the city and between programs.
33	(6) Implementation and monitoring committee. The functions and duties of
34	the implementation and monitoring committee shall be as follows:
35	a. review, evaluate and discuss the quality and effectiveness of key
36	programs as identified in a youth master plan.
37	(7) Youth council. The youth council shall consist of up to 25 members, who
38	shall be citizens. Four of the members must receive city services and/or participate
39	in city programs and represent private and public high schools and city recreation
40	centers. The term of these members shall be two years.
41	a. The council shall elect three members of the council as their
42	officers and voting members of the commission. The term of the officers

1	and voting members shall be for one year. Three adult members of the
2	commission shall be assigned to the youth council, serving as advisors to
3	youth and co-facilitators with the officers for conducting and convening
4	the meetings.
5	b. The functions and duties of the youth council shall be as follows:
6	i. build the foundation that supports youth engagement in the
7	activities of the commission;
8	ii. provide a forum for youth input regarding the effectiveness
9	of programs;
10	iii. represent youth across the city through regular
11	communication with various youth groups; and
12	iv. create opportunities for youth to make a difference in
13	Alexandria policy and decision making processes. (Ord. No. 4727,

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16	Sec. 12-10-3 Meetings; quorum; rules of procedure; annual report.
17	(a) The commission shall meet nine to ten times annually. Working committees shall
18	meet no fewer than six times per yearmay meet as needed. Appointed voting commission
19	members must attend 75 percent of all meetings, including their assigned committees.
20	The terms of the commission's members shall not exceed a total of ten consecutive years
21	of membership on the commission.
22	(b) All voting members of the commission present at a meeting shall be entitled to
23	vote, and the decisions of the commission shall be determined by a majority vote of such
24	members present and voting. A quorum, which shall consist of at least 50 percent of the
25	non-vacant seats on the commission, shall be required in order for the commission to
26	transact business. A member eligible to vote who is present but does not vote shall be
27	considered in counting a quorum. In matters concerning the procedure for meetings not
28	covered by this chapter, the commission may establish its own rules, provided such rules
29	are not contrary to law or the mandate or spirit of this chapter. Otherwise, the rules of
30	procedure set out in Robert's Rules of Order shall apply.
31	(c) The commission shall submit to the city council each year a written report of its
32	activities. The report shall also address the matters described in section 12-13-4(b), and
33	may address other matters relating to the city's youth that the commission may choose to
