




- Section 9.06 of the City's Charter requires that the Planning Commission approve any changes to the use of a public street.
- Planning Commission is charged with ensuring that any change is consistent with the City's Master Plan.

Site Context

 Located within the Waterfront Small Area Plan





Background information



- Alley is one-way, heading east towards the Potomac River
- Prior to the pandemic, Virtue used the southern portion for outdoor dining
- In May 2020, the City temporarily closed the alley to vehicles and allowed Virtue to expand the outdoor dining area further into the alley
 - Approved through the end of 2021
- A new license agreement will be required to allow additional use of the alley
- City will maintain ownership of the alley

Consistency with Master Plan



 Increase and improve access to the public spaces of the Waterfront.
 Pedestrian connectivity along the Waterfront should be continuous.

 Improve the Waterfront's vehicular and pedestrian circulation.

Staff Recommends that the Planning Commission find the proposed change to Wales Alley consistent with Section 9.06 of the City Charter and the City's Master Plan
