#### **Site Context**



 Surrounded by commercial and residential properties

 Zoned CD: 711-719 Princess Street and Sunrise of Old Town

 Zoned RM: 409 and 411 N. Columbus Street



### **Pre-application Timeline**



**April, May 2020** Applicant emails P&Z staff in April and May 2020 asking about the commercial businesses they could operate in CD zone. Applicant does not receive staff reply.

October

City Council approves text amendments to expand the opportunity for outdoor dining and live entertainment to all businesses, not just restaurants, with SUP approval.

**November** 

P&Z staff receive a notarized noise complaint from a resident in November, noting outdoor concerts and dining at 711 Princess Street since the summer.

P&Z inspector issues a warning notice to the applicant.

T&ES creates a temporary noise variance permit option for applicant to hold three concerts prior to next available SUP hearing in March.

Applicant submits SUP application for docketing at the March hearings.

# Indoor restaurant and outdoor dining use for special events

Daily

Four days a month, primarily between March through August

10 a.m. to 10 p.m.; two to eight hours per event

Up to 50 guests



#### **SUP Requests**



### Indoor and outdoor live entertainment

Between one to four concerts a day often on Saturdays and Sundays; Federal holidays and weekdays

Four days a month, primarily between March through August

10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Up to 56 accommodated with socially-distanced seat spacing during COVID-19

Unamplified music






### **Estimated decibel range for outdoor live entertainment**



Noise ordinance limits levels to 60 dB(A) at the property lines

Stage locations measure approximately 10-60 feet to property lines

Decibel range calculated as: 74-89 dB(A) at 20 feet 68-83 dB(A) at 40 feet 62-77 dB(A) at 80 feet

## Planning Commission recommended condition amendments (slide 1 of 3)

- 2. **CONDITION AMENDED BY PLANNING COMMISSION:**
- Indoor live entertainment, restaurant and outdoor dining are permitted on Saturdays and Sundays daily, between 10 a.m. and 10 p.m. All patrons must leave the premises at 10 p.m. (P&Z) (PC)
- 3. <u>CONDITION AMENDED BY PLANNING COMMISSION:</u> The maximum number of indoor seats for the indoor live entertainment and the restaurant uses shall comply with the <u>Virginia Uniform sStatewide</u> building code. (P&Z) (PC)



## Planning Commission recommended condition amendments (slide 2 of 3)

- 9. **CONDITION DELETED BY PLANNING COMMISSION:**
- Unamplified, outdoor, limited live entertainment, serving only as background music for outdoor dining special events and consisting of one musician, may be offered and must comply with the City's noise ordinance. No admission or cover fee may be charged. All entertainment shall be subordinate to the principal function of the restaurant as an eating establishment. Any advertising of the entertainment shall reflect the subordinate nature of the entertainment by featuring food service as well as the entertainment. (P&Z) (PC)
- 10. <u>CONDITION AMENDED BY PLANNING COMMISSION:</u> The indoor live entertainment, restaurant and outdoor dining uses must comply with the city's noise ordinance. No indoor amplified sound shall be audible at the property line after 10:00 PM. (T&ES) (PC)



## Planning Commission recommended condition amendments (slide 3 of 3)

#### 24. **CONDITION AMENDED BY PLANNING COMMISSION:**

The maximum number of outdoor seats for live entertainment shall comply with the Virginia Uniform Statewide building code. be 50. City Council approval is required for an SUP amendment to increase outdoor seating over 50 for live entertainment. (P&Z) (PC)

#### 25. **CONDITION AMENDED BY PLANNING COMMISSION:**

Outdoor live entertainment is permitted on <u>Friday and</u> Saturdays between 10 a.m. and 9 p.m. and Sundays <u>through Thursday</u> <u>between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. (P&Z)</u> (PC)



### Code of Ordinances Section 11-5-2 (26) Noise definition:

A steady-state or impulsive sound or sounds occurring on either a continuous or intermittent basis or any sound which annoys or disturbs humans or which causes or tends to cause an adverse psychological or physiological effect on humans.
