A previous board member for two years with Clover College Park Civic Association and a resident on W. Taylor Run (WTR) who has lived through three floods last summer that have cut off Janneys Lane and WTR to traffic. Previously we haven't experienced such flooding since early 2000's so in the 24 years living here we have six that we've experienced. Much of this is caused from water overtopping a culvert at Francis Hammond and Janneys and we notice that the larger culvert at Janneys and WTR are close to overtopping for the first time ever from these intense rain events. Many homeowners along WTR are also experiencing severe run off from neighbor homes above us on Skyhill Drive during intense storms from downspout volume saturating their backyards. This has become an even more serious problem since the water reaches our homes, whereas the WTR and Janneys flooding cuts travel access or causes vehicle damage to cars parked if not moved in time. I led our neighborhood in zoom meetings with Councilman Chapman to update him on these issues and to get city help. This led to an outdoor meeting in December with various city staff managers and consultants that got us on the map for securing "spot project" status for the Francis Hammond culvert overtopping. We also discussed the grant program that we may be able to avail ourselves in order to find flood management alternatives from the water coming from Skyhill neighbors. I would like to help identify and share practices and protocols that residents like me can use to fix this problem before it happens again. We need a "go to" list of approved contractors that would help residents find the right vendor with the right solution before these problems manifest.

Statement of Interest/ Why you should be appointed

As of this fall, my family and I have lived on Manning Street in Alexandria for five years. We love it. The people, the neighborhood - it is all invaluable and we have felt blessed to call this corner of Alexandria home. Like many others, our street was devastated by the flooding of the past two years. There are roughly 38 homes on our small street and in each of the three events (7/8/19, 7/23/20, 9/10/20) you could count on one hand the number of them that did not experience flooding issues. Some are affected by a main storm drain that runs through an adjacent alleyway, many experience sewage backups, some homes get hit with both. Neighbors have lost cars, business equipment, and personal mementos that can never be replaced. Others have seen back doors blown in and internal walls collapse due to the volume and strength of the water, some have come perilously close to losing pets. One family lost a car, their home insurance (due to repeat claims), and they contracted COVID, all in 2020. The mother was isolating at home with a newborn, they feel certain that the exposure came from either having to wade through knee-deep sewage or from the mitigation crews that were dispatched in the aftermath. The three-monthold was the first to show symptoms.

We have lost neighbors to these issues and many of us have considered moving and/or leaving Alexandria all together. We took solace in learning that ours was a "known issue" because surely that meant a fix was on the way. In digging further, I became increasingly frustrated to learn not only how well "known" our area issues are, but that nothing has been done to address them. We know we were on a 2008 City presentation on flooding, we know that current members of the City Council were in communication with nearby residents as far back as 2002 with promises of "Potomac Yard will fix your issues" and yet even rains that fail far below the 10-year storm mark results in rushing water and backed up drains. My next-door neighbor has lived on this street for over 50 years. He and other long-time residents recall when their own experiences fighting these issues over the decades. We are tired. Tired of feeling abandoned by the City, tired of mitigation crews knowing our names, tired of the unexpected bills totaling tens of thousands, tired of finding and installing the next piece of expensive equipment that may or may not help "next time", and tired of the constant anxiety that presents itself every time it rains.

The financial toll is the easiest to quantify. We have receipts from mitigation and remodel companies, insurance deductibles and denials, and Home Depot for hand pumps, buckets, and quick dams. What cannot be quantified are the hours spent getting sandbags, cleaning up, meeting with contractors, testing systems, learning how to open your sewer line to service your own backflow preventer (yes, we do this before every big rainstorm), and meeting with insurance adjusters. Maybe most devastating though is the mental toll. Watching a mother in Rosemont describe almost losing her newbom to quickly rising water was gut-wrenching. Another speaks of the uncertainty of losing critical business equipment and not knowing how to move forward. Many speak of the overwhelming fear and anxiety even small rain storms bring on. One neighbor who is in the process of listing her home commented that she would "either have to move or start taking medication". Others are seeking therapy. These are the realities of residents across the City because of "known" issues that have been neglected.

After the July 2020 storm, I began working on neighborhood engagement around the issue. As I found new resources or updates from the City I would email them out. In seven months that list has grown from a small cluster of homes around me to include nearly 250 names from at least a dozen neighborhoods. I have met people from all over the City and have learned that the full scope of this problem extends well beyond the bounds of my neighborhood. I have heard stories of people stranded in their one-story home-turned-island who have purchased rafts and vest for themselves and their animals should the water rise higher than it did in the previous storm, of homeowners stepping into a flooded basement and almost being electrocuted, residents stuck in their cars, Alexandria teachers having to disrupt their Zoom lessons

to bail sewage out of their home, waves of water entering homes from cars on the road who refused to turn around, manhole covers spewing sewage into streets, and many more. Put simply, these stories are heartbreaking. I want to be part of the solution, not just for Manning Street but for so many I have met City-wide.
