WHEREAS, according to 2020 Census data, Alexandria's Latino population increased by 30% in the last decade and now stands at just over 18%; and

WHEREAS, throughout our nation's history, Latinos have made significant contributions to social and economic progress through their leadership in government, business, education, the arts, science, and military service; and

WHEREAS, we recognize the disproportionate health and economic impact the COVID-19 pandemic has had in the Latino community and we honor their resilience and look towards a brighter, more equitable future as we continue to fight this pandemic together; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria will join with the rest of the country in celebrating the 53rd National Latino Heritage Month by commemorating essential contributions, sacrifices, and accomplishments that Latino people have made to the United States throughout our nation's history and we encourage our citizens to participate in the celebrations of Latino heritage in Alexandria this month; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JUSTIN M. WILSON, Mayor of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and on behalf of the Alexandria City Council, do hereby proclaim the time between September 15th through October 15th, 2021 as:

"LATINO HERITAGE MONTH"

In the City of Alexandria and encourage all residents to celebrate the significant contributions of Latino Americans in our nation and city.
