City Council: (1) approved the Alexandria Housing Development Corporation's (AHDC) plan to refinance and renovate Lacy Court Apartments utilizing competitive tax credits; (2) approved a partial release of \$4.9 million in debt and accrued interest secured by an existing City loan in exchange for the City receiving an equity position through a future right of first option; (3) approved repayment of \$500,000 by AHDC when the renovation is complete; (4) approved provision of a grant of \$150,000 from the City to AHDC to fund a pilot rental subsidy program to create deep affordability for five units; (5) approved a resolution designating the Lacy Court Apartments sites a Revitalization Area pursuant to Section 36-55.30:2A of the Virginia Code (RES. NO. 2759); and (6) authorized the City Manager to execute documents related to the tax credit application and the refinancing plan.

- (1) Mayor Silberberg reported that the Sheriff's Department recently hosted an event that brought together many different City entities and organizations including the Department of Community and Human Services, Northern Virginia Community College, Neighborhood Health, Legal Services of Northern Virginia and other nonprofits and companies, to help the inmates find opportunities as they transition back into society.
- (2) Mayor Silberberg reported that Jim Curry, a resident of the Alexandria portion of Fairfax County, donated an historic newspaper from 1812 to the Office of Historic Alexandria (OHA) and Mr. Mallamo, Director, of OHA, will be placing the copy of the Alexandria Herald in the City's special collections.
- (3) Mayor Silberberg thanked the staff of the Library Services, particularly Patricia Walker, who helped the North Ridge Citizens' Association preserve their records dating back to the 1940s and she noted that the records are now part of the Alexandria Library system. Mayor Silberberg noted that the North Ridge Citizens' Association also thanked the Department of Planning and Zoning and the Fire Department for their help with the fire station.
- (4) Mayor Silberberg noted that the libraries are accepting books to either be added to the collection for circulation or to be sold at the annual book sale to raise money for support of the libraries throughout the City.
