# ORAL REPORT FROM THE CITY MANAGER

City Manager Jinks stated that Dr. Haering, Health Director, Health Department, would give City Council an update of the flu and how the City was responded to the influx of cases this season. Dr. Haering gave Council an update on the steps the Health Department was taking to combat the increased numbers of flu cases this season. Dr. Haering also gave some tips on how to prevent the spread of the flu virus. Dr. Haering announced that the City received a \$550,000 grant to fight HIV in the community and how reported how the grant will be used to get the City to zero deaths and to prevent new infections and transmission of HIV.
