Mayor Silberberg noted that Council passed a resolution urging state and national legislators to enact common sense gun laws. Mayor Silberberg stated that there should be consideration given to placing School Resource Officers (SROs) in the City's elementary schools and she has requested a budget memo detailing the costs of adding security at the elementary schools similar to the type of security at the middle and high schools. Mayor Silberberg also requested that City Manager Jinks work with Dr. Berlin, Interim Superintendent, and Police Chief Brown to come up with options as soon as possible on how to accomplish this request.
