City Manager Jinks introduced Mr. Duval, Deputy Director, Transportation and Environmental Services and Ms. Lee, Transportation and Environmental Services, to discuss glass recycling in the City. ORAL REPORTS AND ORAL PRESENTATIONS BY MEMBERS OF CITY COUNCIL

- 1. Councilman Aguirre reported that he attended the World AIDS Day interfaith service at St. Joseph's Catholic Church on December 1 and noted that the event was well attended by the community.
- 2. Councilman Aguirre congratulated the West End Business Association (WEBA) on celebrating its 15-year anniversary on December 3.
- 3. Councilman Aguirre reported that he stopped at the Alexandria Mobility Plan popups on Sunday and he noted that the City has been working to bring more opportunities like these to engage the community.
- 4. Councilman Aguirre reported the the Northern Virginia Healthy Families Program was hosted at Temple Beth-El and they honored the graduates of the program on December 9.
- 5. Mayor Wilson proposed that Council initiate a text amendment to amend the existing overlay zone to allow daycare centers to operate on the first floor of buildings in the retail focus area.

City Council moved to initiate a text amendment to amend the Mount Vernon Overlay Zone.

- 6. Councilwoman Pepper noted that there will be a groundbreaking for the Potomac Yard Metrorail Station soon and highlighted the role that the City Manager and staff have played in getting the project started.
- 7. Councilwoman Jackson spoke about the recent decision on the Seminary Road repaying and reconfiguration. Councilwoman Jackson read a statement about rescinding the decision of Council from September 19 in order for Council to pause and review the decision amid public concern, noting her concerns about public safety and quality of life.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Jackson to rescind the decision of City Council's vote on September 19, 2019 that approved the implementation of the Seminary Road diet. The motion died for lack of second.

A motion was again by Councilwoman Jackson, seconded by Councilman Seifeldein to rescind the decision of City Council's vote on September 19, 2019 that approved the implementation of the Seminary Road diet. Council requested that staff and members of Council be give some time to respond to Councilwoman Jackson's concerns. Councilwoman Jackson agreed to withdraw the motion and table the discussion for another meeting.
