6. <u>20-0424</u> Update on the 2020 Virginia General Assembly Session.

Clty Council approved the legislative positions included in the Recommended Positions on Bills of Impact of the City as recommended by Council's Legislative Subcommittee (Mayor Wilson and Vice Mayor Bennett-Parker) at the Subcommittee's January 17 and January 24 meetings.

7. <u>20-0510</u> Report and Recommendations from the Boards and Commissions Audit/Review Committee.

Clty Council received the report from the Committee and approved the recommendations on changes to the processes and procedures for City boards, commissions and committees and directed staff to return with the necessary legislation to implement any changes, included updates to the City Code and creation of a fundraising policy for boards and commissions. City Council also directed the Committee to generate a list of boards and commissions (1) that have composition change requests; (2) boards which have been dormant for a period; and (3) boards that have potential for consolidation for efficiency purposes.

ORAL REPORTS AND ORAL PRESENTATIONS BY MEMBERS OF CITY COUNCIL

- 1. Vice Mayor Bennett-Parker reported that there will be new Eco-City Academy beginning in the Spring related to the Environmental Act Plan 2040 and she noted that applications are due Friday, February 12. Vice Mayor Bennett-Parker aslo noted that application deadline are upcoming for the Fire Academy, the City Academy and Police Academy.
- 2. Councilman Aguirre reported that he and Vice Mayor Bennett-Parker participated in a photo-op for the AT1+ improvements, which were funded by the I-395 Commuter Choice. Councilman Aguirre noted that the buses are fully wrapped and have "Welcome to the West End' on them in three different languages, English, Spanish and Amharic. Councilman Aguirre also noted that ridership was up since last November.
- 3. Councilman Aguirre reported that he attended International Night at Mount Vernon Community School last Friday and he recognized Rosa Landeros, the Parent Liaison for Mount Vernon Community School, for being named a Living Legend for 2020, the first Latina recipient.
- 4. Councilman Aguirre recognized Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition of Alexandria for holding a ribbon cutting for the permanent drug dropbox at the Police Station on Saturday.
- 5. Councilman Aguirre reported that he went to Richmond to the General Assembly for Transportation Lobby Day to speak to about the importance of transportation bills being considered this session.
- 6. Councilman Aguirre announced that the City will be offering free tax preparation on February 1 for residents on Wednesdays and Fridays.
