Mayor Wilson noted that he had a discussion with staff to see if there were ways either through escalating fines or towing of vehicles that would achieve what the adopted provision intended and to prevent these kinds of activities. Mayor Wilson requested that return with an amendment to the Code that would allow for the escalation of fines and the potential for towing of vehicles for Council consideration.

2. Councilman Chapman reported that he met with Fort Ward residents about the upcoming phases for Fort Ward and received their concerns with the process going forward.
