


- Discuss APD's crime reduction strategies, year-over-year data, and outcomes.






State of Public Safety

- Major and mid-size cities in metropolitan areas have seen overall reductions in major crime.
- Similarly, the Commonwealth has seen a reduction of crime of an average of 10-14% per capita.
- Since 2024, Alexandria has seen reductions of crime by 57% per capita.

APD's Crime Reduction Strategy

- Implementation of evidence-based strategies.
- Strategic weekly crime review and coordination with city departments and businesses.
- Repurposing of specialized policing units.
- Focused deterrence and enforcement.





APD's Crime Reduction Strategy

- Investment in building public trust and community engagement.
- Community education through partnership and collaboration.
- Investment in and utilization of modern technology.





2025 Review – Citywide



Overall crime is down -30% compared to 2024. Below is a breakdown for each offense category and specific offenses within those categories.



Violent Crimes Comparison



Defined as any crime committed against the individual that causes bodily harm.



Property Crime Comparison



Defined as any crimes committed for the purpose of obtaining money, property or some other benefit.



Long-Term Public Safety Plan

- Implement 5-year Public Safety Plan that aligns with City Council and Community priorities.
- Deepen relational engagement between police and the communities we serve.
- Make Alexandria the safest city in America.
